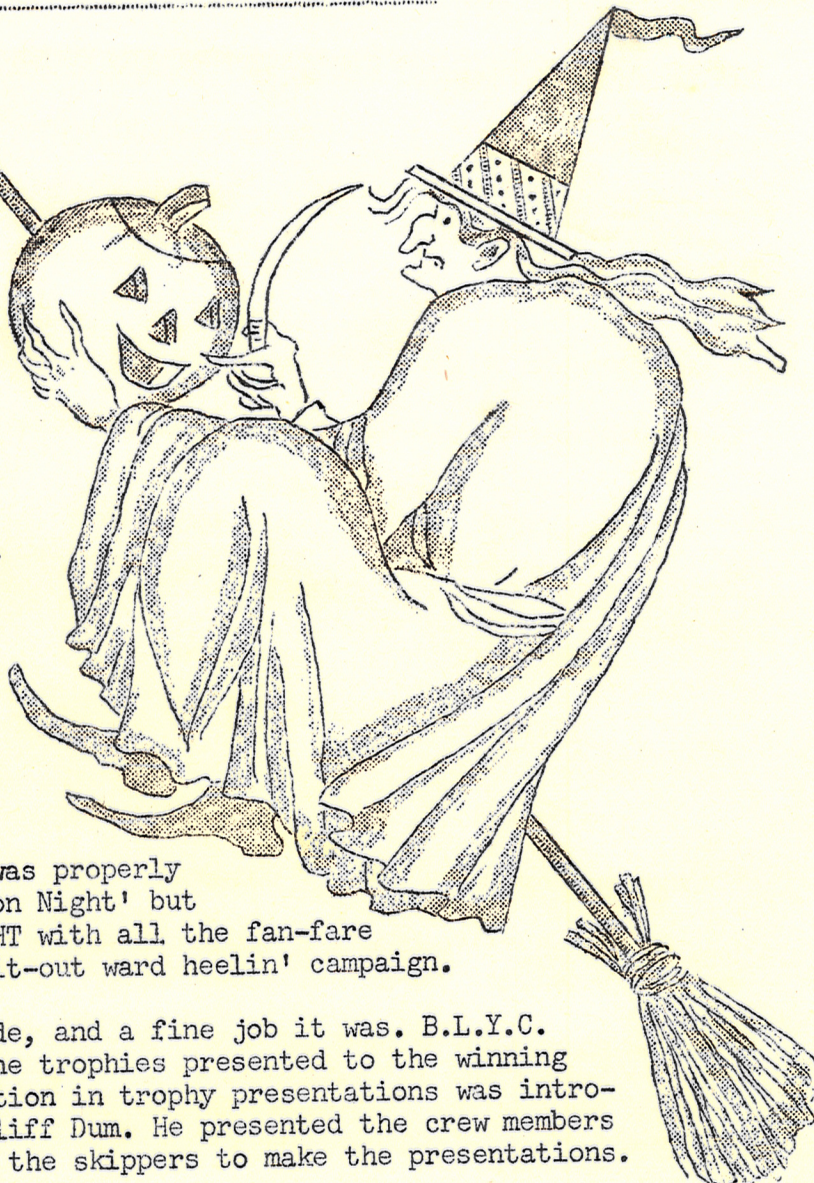

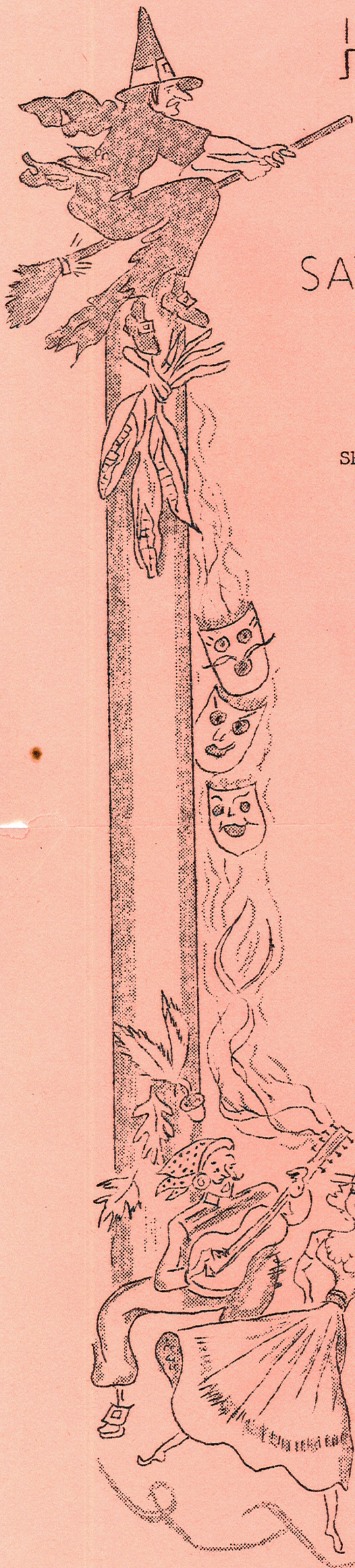
BOATHOUSE & PERMANENT DOCK COMMITTEE
