

HAUL OUT TIME...is just about here. It presents the usual problems but if a fellow follows a few basic rules...it will save him a lot of work, come Spring.

One thing is a 'must'. When you haul your boat, give it a good scrubbing. Use any one of the popular detergents on the deck and top-sides and, by all means, use some steel wool plus a lot of strong arm stuff on the bottom. If you will spend one hour doing this when you haul your boat, it will save many hours next Spring.

Proper storage is another important thing. Most boat owners prefer to store their boats OUTSIDE. Outside storage is best particularly when the boat is fully protected by a good 'tarp' and well ventilated. When so protected, the ice and snow IS GOOD

for the boat. Any yard master will confirm this. NEVER store your boat in a heated room, that is one sure way of ruining a boat RIGHT NOW.



Your mast should be stored inside is possible and supported at 8 or 10 foot spacings. Store in a dry, cool place. During the winter, check all mast fittings and rigging, it pays off. All mast tangs, spreaders, fittings, etc should be checked and replaced if necessary.

Coil your line and store in a dry, cool spot, don't leave them on the boat.

Be sure your boat is well supported while in storage. Many boats are ruined by improper and careless shoring.
