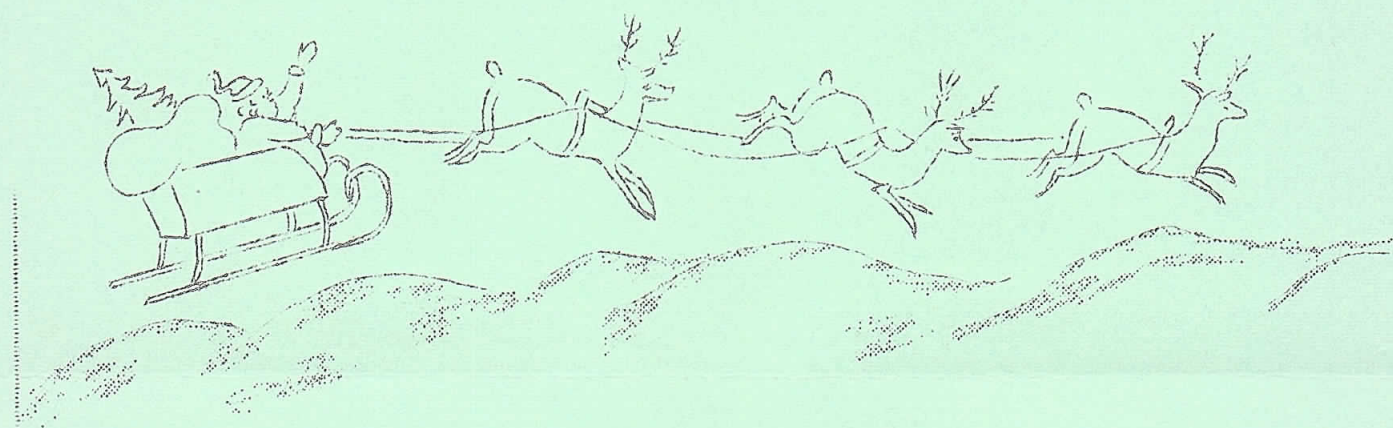

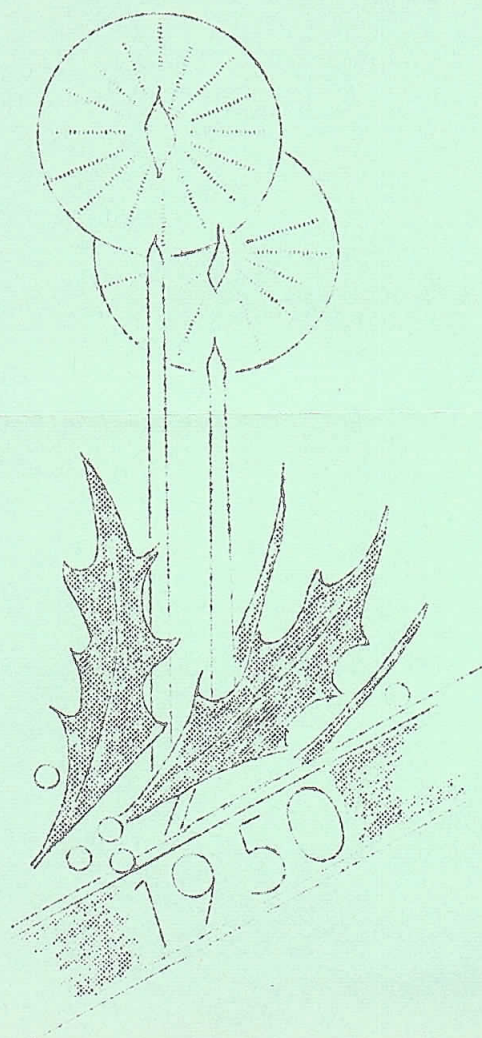

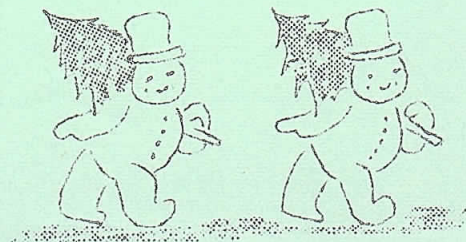

COST...\$1.25 per plate, includes everything.

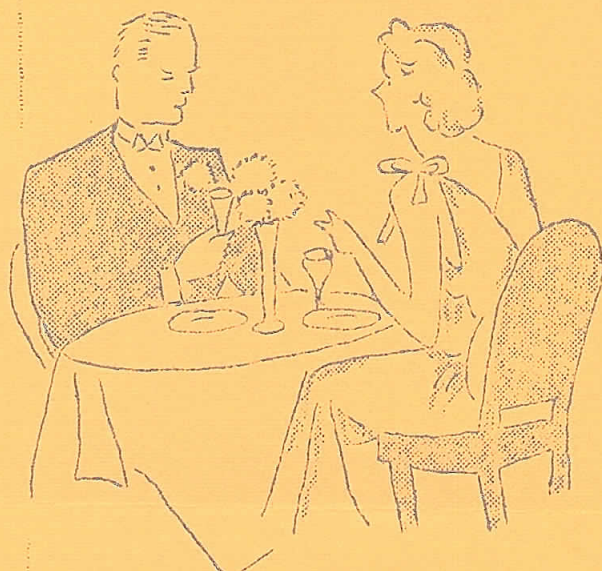
If you don't like sauer kraut, many other foods are available...BUT, again you must make reservations. Use the same post card enclosed with this mailing and mark as indicated.

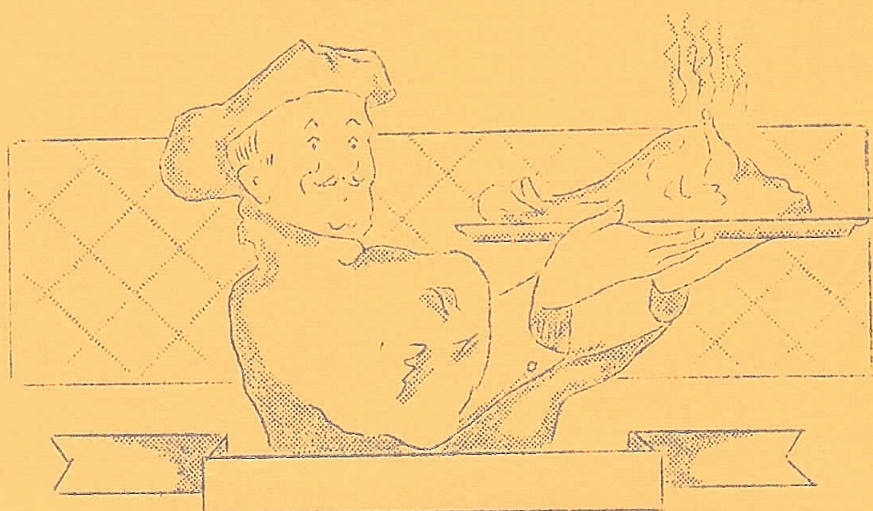
DRESS, optional. Many will choose to dig out the "Tux" and spruce up a bit and some will say, "The heck with that" and come in business suits. Makes no difference.

BOWLING PARTY

NEWT DAVIS, Chairman of the Bowling Committee, is very anxious to make up a good B.L.Y.C. party for the annual tournament of the Inter-Lake Yachtsmen's Bowling Association to be held in Detroit, February 4-5, 1950. We publish below, the release from the Inter-Lake office.

"A.H.Martin of the Windsor Yacht Club, President of the Inter-lake Yachtsmen's Bowling Association has announced February 4-5, 1950 as the dates for this year's tournament".

The tournament is going to be an international affair with the bowler's headquarters at the Prince Edward Hotel, Windsor, Ontario, Canada and the bowling at the Detroit Recreation Alleys, Detroit, Michigan.

Bowling will start at 3:00 PM sharp at the Detroit Recreation Alleys, 212 W. Lafayette St. Arrangements have been made to accommodate a single squad of 400 bowlers at one time on the Detroit Recreation's alleys, a total of 88 alleys on all floors.

The banquet and awarding of prizes will take place in the Prince Edward Hotel Ballroom on the mezzanine floor promptly at 7:00 PM. Following the banquet, there will be a floor show for your entertainment of the finest talent available in this area.

Open House will be held adjacent to the ballroom from 5:30 PM. This is an American Bowling Congress sanctioned tournament open to all bowlers who are members of a yacht club affiliated with the Inter-Lake Yachting Association.

The tournament will be conducted on an 'over average' basis, divided into three classes: Class "A" (800 and up); Class "B" (700 and up); Class "C" (699 down). In addition to these classes, there will be a special "Booster" Class for those bowlers who do not bowl in a regular league.

Due to the fact that the bowlers will be crossing the border between Canada and the United States several times during the tournament, proper identification papers will be necessary. Please bring birth certificate, naturalization papers (if foreign born), voter's registration card or some similar identification to facilitate the border crossing. Every effort will be made to make the crossing as expedient as possible. Transportation from the hotel and the Detroit Recreation Alleys will be fast, adequate and comfortable."
