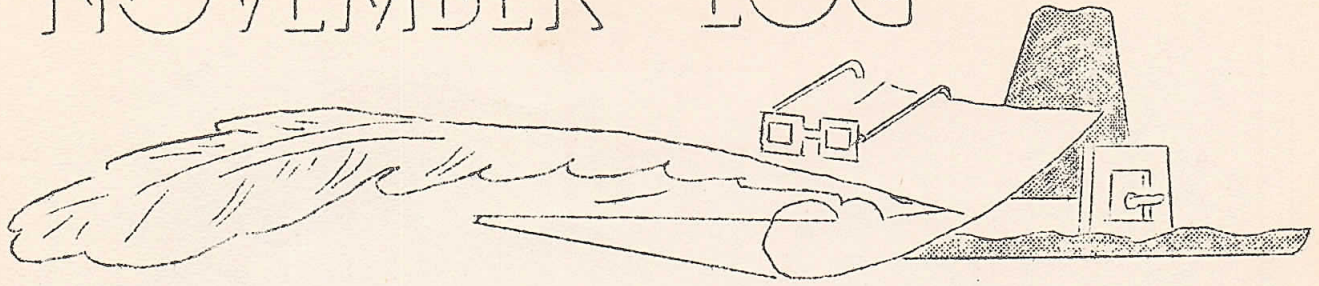


# NOVEMBER LOG

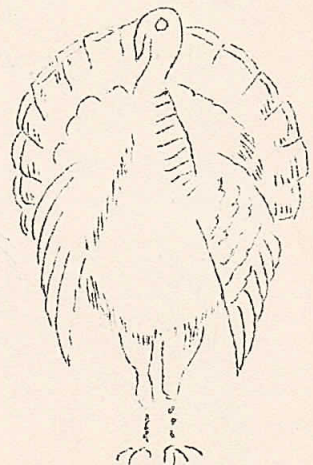
HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO FIND \$92,000.00? Sounds pretty good? Well, listen to this true story.....
