Hi There, Guys and Gals.....

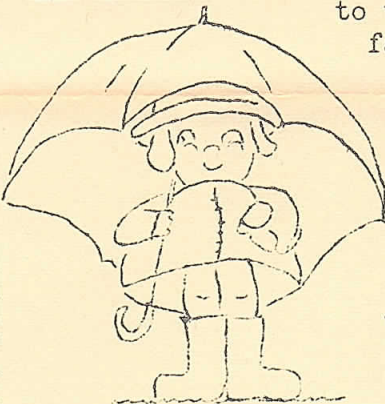

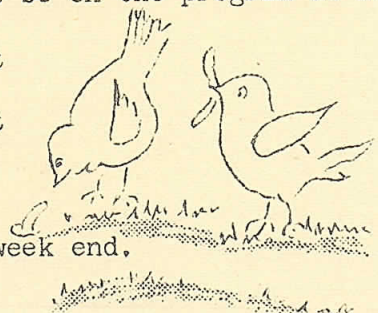
OUTDOCR STORE in Grandview will hold their Annual Boat Show April 27-28-29.

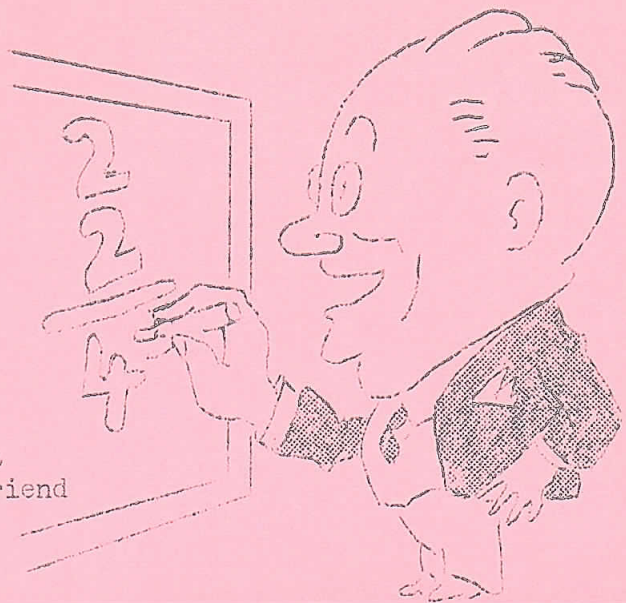

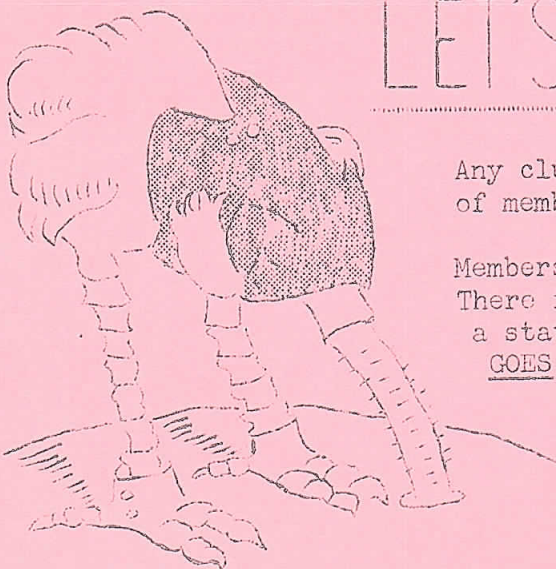
