The candidates have been selected and they are.....

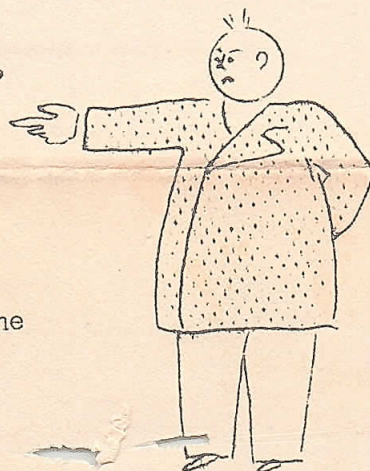

Bob Slattery



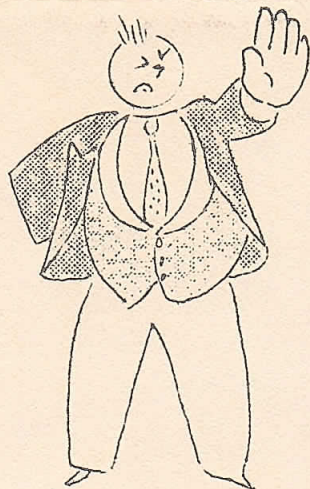
One Trustee will be elected for a period of five years. The candidates are....
