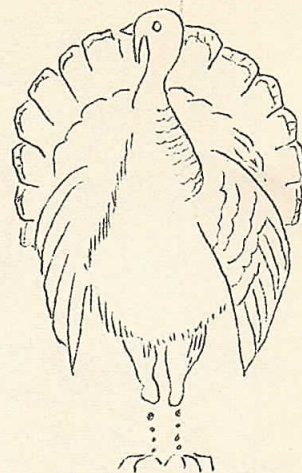

A LETTER FROM YOUR COMMODORE

Dear Fellow Members of B.L.Y.C.,

It is our purpose, in the next eleven months, to keep you informed on the various projects approved by your officers and members of the Board of Governors which will directly concern you as a member of our fine Yacht Club. The following projects have been approved....

1. The yacht basin will be completed. The entrance will be narrowed and the lake side of the docks will be fully planked to insure full protection within the basin.
2. The clubhouse will be painted on the outside. It will be painted with two coats of white paint.
3. The area surrounding the shuffle board courts will be black topped but in this case the topping will be green.
4. The boat hoist and flag poles will be painted and checked for security.
5. The bridge to our island will be repaired on a permanent basis.
6. Boat slips and cat walks will be repaired and new ones built as the need increases.
7. The lawn will be seeded and restored to a good condition.
8. The area under the club will be subjected to a real house-cleaning in the Spring.
9. A new incinerator will be constructed to meet the ever increasing demand for refuse disposal.
10. The installation of air jets around our docks is now under consideration. This would remove the high cost of ice cutting each winter.
11. The insurance coverage on our clubhouse is now in the hands of a special committee instructed to make specific recommendations on further coverage and the possible use of mechanical protective means.
12. The Regatta Committee will have full plans for season racing for three classes including Lightnings, Kays and Ravens.
13. The Membership Committee will conduct a membership campaign and all members are urged to get a new member, right now. Six applications have been filed since the Fall Meeting.
14. The Entertainment Committee will enlarge their activities effective at once. This phase of our club interest has increased tremendously and must be continued.
15. Junior activities will be increased in 1952. This has become a very important function of our club.
16. Consideration is now being given to the proper investment of our club money to bring in the best return. We are very mindful of the fact that the present boat house must be replaced if and when the money and materials are available.

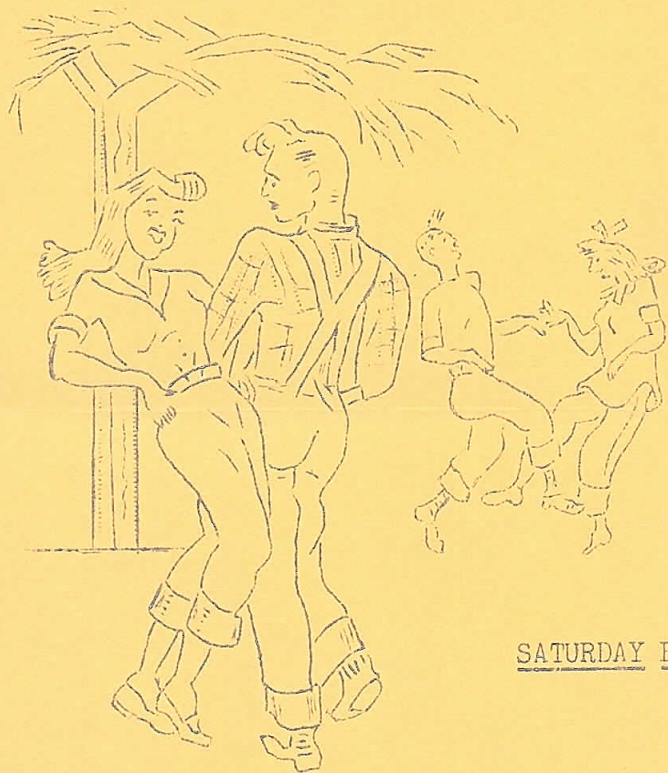

Set-up will be available. In other words, it is the same situation as at our Yacht Club. It works out fine.

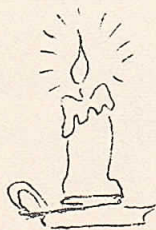
PARKING SPACE ... Lots of it at the Fiesta Club
