It is still our opinion that we must guard our finances most carefully. We are ECONOMY MINDED and we think it to be good business. Here are two major projects that WILL BE completed this Spring.

- 1. THE YACHT BASIN ... In the opinion of your Board, the completion of the docks and yacht basin is a MUST in 1952. More boats are coming in, more slips are needed. The docks will be fully protected by sheeting this year. This is necessary in order to protect the boats moored in the basin. The entrance to the basin will be narrowed to further protect the water in the basin. New slips will be added and repairs made to the old slips.
- 2. THE CLUB WILL BE PAINTED ... This is a major project and a necessary one. Two coats of white paint will be applied and this should improve our property very much.
- 3. A CONCRETE STRIP will be constructed between the shuffle board court and the walk. The original plan called for a black topping all around the courts, but costs have increased to an alarming degree so this must be by-passed this year.

Other projects are listed entailing lesser costs but project #1 and #2 are most important.

It costs a heap of money to operate our club and we assure you that your Board of Governors are spending only those amounts deemed necessary to maintain our property to the full interest of our members.
