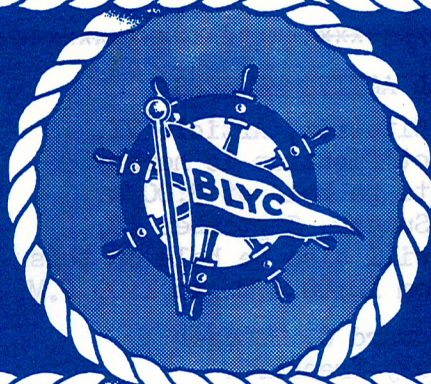

WINDFALL

Gov. Metzger has discovered that the Club may be entitled to a refund of the excise taxes paid on the dues for the fiscal year 5/1/65 to 4/30/66. This possibility was brought about by the repeal of this tax as of 1/1/66. Since we pay monthly all of this tax, we would be overpaid about 33.3%. After discussion with Internal Revenue, it was decided the best possible way to apply for this refund would be to have all the membership sign a waiver to enable your Club to benefit by this being added into the Club Treasury. It is interesting to note the following schedule of possible refunds if each member would file for his refund as to what extent it would benefit him personally:

The possible return to any one member would, as shown, be very slight, but taken on the larger scope, it can mean quite a lot to your Club. Many clubs were considering increases in dues to make up for the ever increasing costs of running an organization such as ours, but with this repeal of the excise tax, this will not be necessary next year as the dues can be raised to take up the slack made by the elimination of the need to pay this tax. A return postcard is enclosed and we would appreciate your signature and return promptly.
