Notes From The Commodore

It is with great pleasure and with much appreciation to Doris and Bob Irwin that I can announce the acquisition of 35 feet of waterfront lease immediately east of Eddie Friedman's property. Plans and discussions with the State of Ohio are under way as to how we can make use of this frontage for additional dock space. There has been a strong feeling among many members for sometime that our limited dock facilities, and particularly the availability of slips for modern cruisers, was holding back the growth of the Club. We hope now to provide for this need. Any members desiring one of the new slips when they become available should write a letter to Gov. Gene Hayes. The slip rentals have not yet been determined by the Board of Governors.

Gov. Boswell has purchased a new ice machine for \$800., capable of producing 500 lbs. of ice every so often. This is a much needed improvement, since the old machine was frequently not working and the repair bill and inconvenience to members were mounting.

Gov. Boswell, with the aid of Heine Cline, has refurbished the men's room upstairs and it is indeed a major improvement. Our thanks to both.

There is also a new hot table in the kitchen which was constructed with the combined help of Roundy Sproat, Art Schwoerer and Max Slaughter. Lights were installed by Newt and Tommy Davis. Theda reports everything is working fine and service will be facilitated. Our thanks to all who made this possible on our limited budget.

P/C Schwoerer has agreed to put the shuffle board courts in good shape so that a shuffle board league can get started. We have arranged for new equipment, and the kids will not be allowed to use the adult equipment, but will have their own. This is really a competitive game — not unlike the starting line of the 4th of July — and we hope everyone will participate. Competition can be with men's league, women's league, mixed league and juniors. Further notice will be forthcoming from Gov. Ray Walker's entertainment committee.
