NOTES FROM THE COMMODORE

IT IS A UNIQUE AND WONDERFUL FEELING TO BE ELECTED COMMODORE OF BLYC AND TO RECEIVE CONGRATULATIONS AND GOOD WISHES FROM SO MANY FRIENDS. THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO HAVE OFFERED THEIR SERVICES TO MAKE 1967 A GOOD YEAR FOR THE CLUB HAS BEEN MOST GRATIFYING, AND WE CERTAINLY CAN USE HELP FROM EVERYONE. IN THE SEVEN YEARS OF OUR PARTICIPATION, THE CLUB HAS BEEN A GREAT BLESSING TO THE COX FAMILY AND WE HOPE TO SHOW OUR APPRECIATION WITH A YEAR OF ACCOMPLISHMENT.

THE TRUSTEES HAVE GIVEN THEIR PERMISSION FOR THE COMPLETION OF ALL 22 OF THE NEW DOCKS. THIS IS POSSIBLE BECAUSE OF THE FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE BY P/C OFFENBERG'S ADMINISTRATION. ALREADY SOME 12 OF THESE ARE RENTED AND ANY OTHERS DESIRING DOCK SPACE, ARE REQUESTED TO CONTACT R/C METZGER IMMEDIATELY. THE DOCKS WILL BE FINISHED BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

WHILE COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS WILL BE COVERED ELSEWHERE IN THE LOG, I WOULD LIKE TO OFFER MY CONGRATULATIONS -- AND YOURS AS WELL -- TO THE TWO NEWLY ELECTED FLAG OFFICERS, V/C DALE DUPLER AND R/C EDDIE METZGER. BOTH OF THESE GENTLEMEN AND THEIR FAMILIES HAVE NOT ONLY WORKED ON MANY OCCASIONS, AND AT GREAT LENGTH FOR THE CLUB, BUT HAVE DEMONSTRATED OTHER QUALITIES OF LEADERSHIP WHICH INDICATE A BRIGHT FUTURE.

THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS HAS AGREED TO OPEN MEMBERSHIP TO 50 NEW MEMBERS IN 1967. GOVERNOR WALKER HAS ASSUMED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE LEADERSHIP OF THIS EFFORT. EACH GOVERNOR HAS BEEN ASSIGNED A QUOTA OF TWO NEW MEMBERS AND THE COMMODORE HAS ACCEPTED A QUOTA OF FOUR. ONE HUNDRED AND FOURTEEN DOLLARS STILL PAYS FOR THE INITIATION FEES AND ONE YEAR'S DUES, FROM JUNE 1 OF '67 TO JUNE 1 OF '68. WE HOPE YOU WILL PROPOSE PERSONS FROM AMONG YOUR FRIENDS WHO WOULD MAKE GOOD FAMILIES IN OUR CLUB.

SINCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE WEST BASIN AND SEAWALL IN ABOUT 1958, FOR \$15,000., AND THE PURCHASE OF THE ISLAND IN ABOUT 1963, FOR ABOUT \$12,000. YOUR CLUB HAS HAD SOME DIFFICULTIES IN MEETING THE INCREASING COSTS OF MAINTENANCE AND STILL MAKING SIGNIFICANT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS. IN SPITE OF THIS DIFFICULTY, EACH ADMINISTRATION HAS DONE A SPLENDID JOB OF MAINTAINING OUR FACILITIES AND IMPROVING THEM. IT IS POSSIBLE THAT THIS YEAR WE WILL HAVE FROM \$7,000. TO \$9,000. TO SPEND ON CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND STILL DO THE NECESSARY MAINTENANCE. WE HAVE ESTABLISHED A COMMITTEE UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF P/C ART SCHWOERER TO SCREEN ALL PROJECT SUGGESTIONS, TO COST THEM OUT, AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AS TO WHICH ONE, OR MORE, OF THE SUGGESTIONS ARE THE MOST FEASIBLE FOR THIS ADMINISTRATION. ALL MEMBERS ARE INVITED TO DROP A NOTE TO ART SCHWOERER MAKING ANY SUGGESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE FOR IMPROVEMENT IN THE CLUB FACILITIES.

WE SINCERELY HOPE TO HAVE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT BOTH THE WINTER SEASON AND THE SUMMER SEASON. WE HOPE YOU FIND THESE OPPOR-TUNITIES ATTRACTIVE AND THAT YOU WILL PARTICIPATE IN THEM.
