NOTES FROM R/C METZGER

AS MENTIONED IN THE NOVEMBER ISSUE, THE BOARD HAS STUDIED THE PROPOSAL OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR 1967. AT THEIR OCT. 28 MEETING APPROVAL WAS GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE NEW BUDGET AND CHARGES. THE DUES ARE RAISED FROM \$44.00 TO \$48.00. THE CAP-ITAL IMPROVEMENT REMAINS THE SAME AS BEFORE AT \$14. THE INITIATION FEE HAS OFFICIALLY BEEN SET AT \$52., AND WITH THE DUES AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, AN AP-PLICANT CAN SUBMIT HIS APPLICATION FOR A TOTAL OF \$114.00.

THE RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE DOCKAGE WERE APPROVED, BUT VARIOUS RATES APPLY TO THE DOCKAGE. A DIAGRAM HAS BEEN PLACED IN THE TELEPHONE ROOM, AND A COPY IS INSIDE THE ASSIGNMENT BOARD ON THE FRONT PORCH. IF YOU HAVE DOCKAGE, IT WOULD BE ADVISABLE TO LOOK AT THIS DIAGRAM TO ASCERTAIN YOUR RATE FOR NEXT YEAR. CONSIDERATION HAS BEEN GIVEN THE EASE OF ENTRANCE AND EXIT, AS WELL AS THE BASIC THEORY OF AREA OF THE SLIPS WITH EMPHASIS ON THE WIDTH OF THE FACILITY.

IN ADDITION TO EACH RATE SHOWN WILL BE THE STATE




