MESSAGE FROM THE COMMODORE

OUR SECOND SATURDAY NIGHT'S SING ON THE LAST SATURDAY NIGHT IN FEBRUARY WAS A BIGGER SUCCESS THAN THE FIRST ONE. WE HAD 36 MEMBERS PRESENT AND THE SONG WORDS WERE EXCELLENT SO EVERYONE WAS "IN FULL VOICE". SOME WERE EVEN HOARSE THE NEXT DAY. WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO HOLD THE SING THE FOURTH SATURDAY IN MARCH BECAUSE THE KITCHEN WILL BE CLOSED. WE ARE SCHEDULING THE NEXT ONE FOR SATURDAY NIGHT, APRIL 15th.

GLENVILLE THOMAS AND HIS ACCOMPANIST, VIRGIL, WILL BE ON HAND AGAIN. WE WILL EXTEND THE NUMBER OF SONGS FOR WHICH THE WORDS ARE TYPED OUT AND EASY TO READ. WE URGE YOU TO PLAN TO COME OUT AND HAVE A BUFFET DINNER ON APRIL 15, AND SING WITH THE GROUP.

THEDA SAYS IT HAS BEEN SIX YEARS SINCE SHE HAS HAD A VACATION, AND SHE REALLY DESERVES ONE AT THE PRESENT TIME. ON THE WEEK END OF MARCH 1 AND 5 WE HAD AN EMERGENCY IN THE DOCKS DEPARTMENT WHEN THE NEW DOCKING FACILITY WAS ENCASED IN ICE. UNFORTUNATELY, THE TRESSURE OF THE ICE CAUSED THE TWO INCH PIPE SUPPLYING THE BUBBLE SYSTEM TO BREAK IN TWO, SO THAT THE OUTER END OF THE FACILITY WAS ALMOST COMPLETELY ICED IN. DON DOWNEY, GOV. JIM MC-LANE, P/C CHRIS LAMBRECHT, P/C CLAUDE MCGINNIS, P/C GEORGE OF FENBERG, V/C DALE DUPLER, AND OTHERS WHOSE NAMES CANNOT BE CALLED TO MIND AT THE MOMENT. (I HOPE YOU WILL FORGIVE ME). WE HOPE THE ICE THREAT IS OVER FOR THE CURRENT SEASON AND THAT BY NEXT YEAR WE WILL HAVE A MORE EFFECTIVE BUBBLE SYSTEM AND MORE EFFECTIVE SURVEILLANCE OF THE CONDITIONS SO THIS SITUATION WOULD NOT REPEAT ITSELF.
