COMMENTS FROM THE COMMODORE

THE FIRST ORDER OF NEWS THIS MONTH IS TO REPORT TO YOU A VERY NARROW ESCAPE WITH OUR EVER PRESENT FIRE HAZARD. ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT, APRIL 12, ALL WAS WELL WHEN THEDA RETIRED ABOUT 1 A.M. HER HUSBAND, JIM, LEFT FOR WORK AT 5 A.M. AND SMELLED NO SMOKE. AT ABOUT 8:30 OUR NEW STEWARD SMELLED SMOKE, AND UPON ENTERING THE LOUNGE FOUND ONE OF THE GREEN SOFAS IN HIGH BLAZE. THE CLUB HAD BEEN CLEAN THE NIGHT BEFORE AND A BEER BOTTLE PLUS POTATO CHIPS WERE FOUND IN THE VICINITY OF THE BURNING SOFA. IT WAS A NARROW ESCAPE AND WE ARE GRATEFUL TO BOB NORMAN (STEWARD) FOR ACTING QUICKLY AND BEING "ON-THE-JOE".

WE WOULD NEED TO RAISE AT LEAST \$100,000 FOR A NEW CLUBHOUSE AND THAT WOULD BE PAINFUL, EVEN WITH MORTGAGES (THEY TAKE INTEREST PAYMENTS, TOO).

WE SOLICIT THE CONSCIOUSNESS OF THE PROBLEM ON THE PART OF ALL MEMBERS AND ASK YOUR EVERY COOPERATION IN REDUCING THE FIRE RISK.

THE THIRD AND LAST "SATURDAY NIGHT DINNER AND SING" WAS A GREAT SUCCESS ON APRIL 15.

GLENN THOMAS IS JUST TREMENDOUS AS A LEADER AND THE EFFORT AND PERSONAL SACFIFICE HE HAS PUT INTO THESE FIRST THREE IS GREATLY APPRECAITED. NEXT SEASON HE WILL BE BACK AGAIN STRONG AND THIS WILL CERTAINLY BECOME A SERIES OF BRIGHT SPOTS IN THE LONG WINTER MONTHS. LAST NIGHT FOR THE FIRST TIME ATTENDING WE HAD PHIL AND CLARA LOUISE BIDLACK, BILL AND CECE GRAHAM, DAIE AND GLADYS LAWRENCE, MURRAY AND JUNE HEADLEE, MAC AND RUSTY MCGINNIS, WHITEY AND HELEN LIMES, ERNIE AND LIL WILSON, LLOYD AND NORA BALLENGER, EARL AND KAY WILLIAMS, KEN AND JANE MERRILL, GEORGE BRUSH AND OTHERS. ALL THE REGULARS FROM THE FIRST TWO SESSIONS WERE ALSO PRESENT. NEXT YEAR WE SHOULD SCHEDULE ALL OF THEM IN ADVANCE, SO ALL CAN PLAN TO BE PRESENT FOR A GOOD DINNER AND LE HOURS OF GOOD SINGING FUN.

OUR MEMBERSHIP DRIVE IS PROGRESSING NICELY WITH 27 NEW MEMBERS AND APPLICATIONS IN THE FIRST SEVEN MONTHS. ELSEWHERE YOU SEE THE SCORE BETWEEN THE BOARDS AND THE MEMBERSHIP. LOOKS LIKE THE TRUSTEES AND THE GOVERNORS ARE GOING TO WIN UNLESS THE REST OF THE MEMBERSHIP KEEPS WORKING.

ONE OF OUR PAST COMMODORES HAS SUGGESTED THAT THE PRESENT SEVEN WEEK CAMPAIGN PERIOD PRECEDING ELECTIONS IS TOO LONG TO PROPERLY SERVE THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CLUB. COMING BETWEEN AUGUST 1 AND SEPT. 20 IT CAUSES TENSIONS AT THE PEAK OF THE CLUB'S SUMMER ACTIVITIES AND AS ALL ELECTIONS THAT ARE CONTESTED DO-INTERFERS WITH THE UNITY OF THE MEMBERS FOR SO LONG A PERIOD. AT PRESENT NOMINATIONS ON AUGUST 1 START THE CAMPAIGN AND OTHERS HAVE UNTIL SEPT. 1 TO FILE FOR THEMSELVES AND ELECTION IS THE CLOSEST SUNDAY TO SEPT. 20. AFTER DISCUSSION BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND GOV-

ERNORS IT WAS DECIDED TO RECOMMEND TO THE MEMBERSHIP THAT
THE CONSTITUTION BE SLIGHTLY AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT THE
CLUB MEMBERSHIP BE NOTIFIED BY LETTER OF THE NOMINATIONS
WITHIN THREE DAYS BEFORE SEPT. 1 AND THAT INDIVIDUAL NOMINATIONS BE SUBMITTED TO THE SECRETARY BY SEPT. 10. THIS
ALLOWS FOR A THREE WEEK ELECTION CAMPAIGN WITH USUALLY FOUR
WEEK-END PERIODS. THIS WILL BE VOTED UPON AT THE SPRING

THIS RECOMMENDATION HAS THE SUPPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (FOUR PRESENT AND VOTING FAVORABLY), AND THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS (EIGHT PRESENT AND VOTING FAVORABLY), AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION (P/C GEORGE FISHER).

A LETTER FROM P/C ART SCHWOERER IN ST. PETE TELLS OF JAY LIM-BAUGH AND BOB MANN'S PARTICIPATION IN THE WINT'ER LIGHTNING CHAMPIONSHIPS. ONLY JAY HAD HIS BOAT, BUT NEXT YEAR BLYC WILL HAVE MORE AFTER THIS YEAR'S BEAUTIFUL WEATHER.
