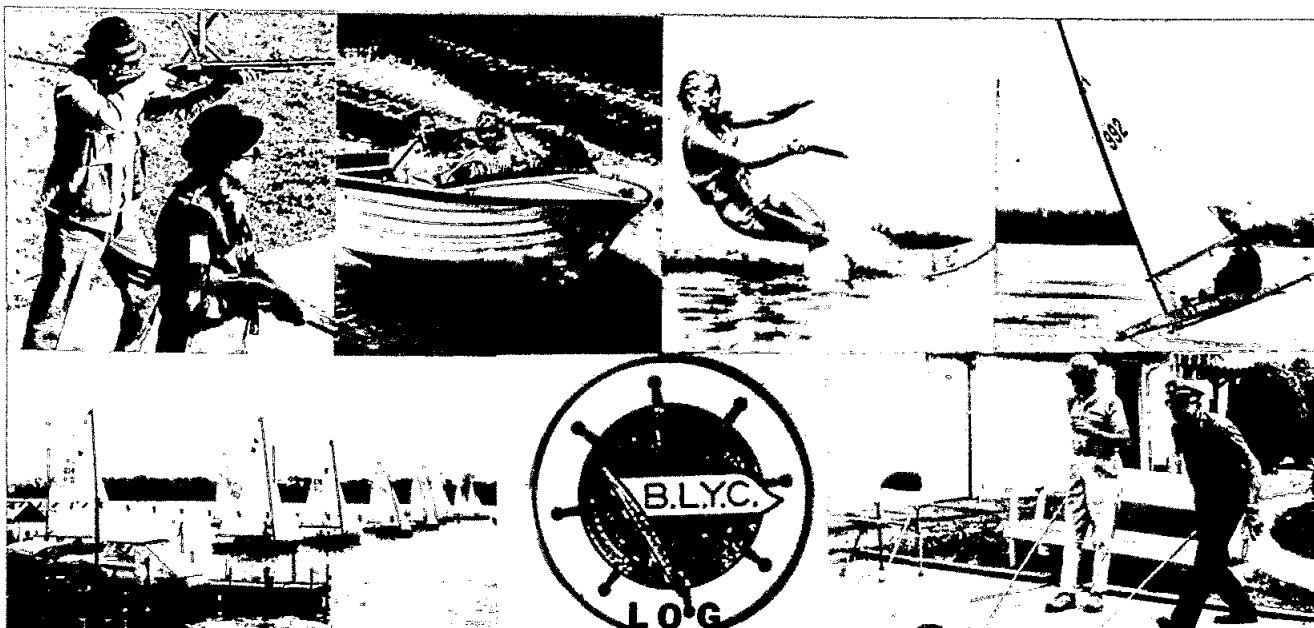

This will be the first patio dance of the season, and is included on your Booster ticket.

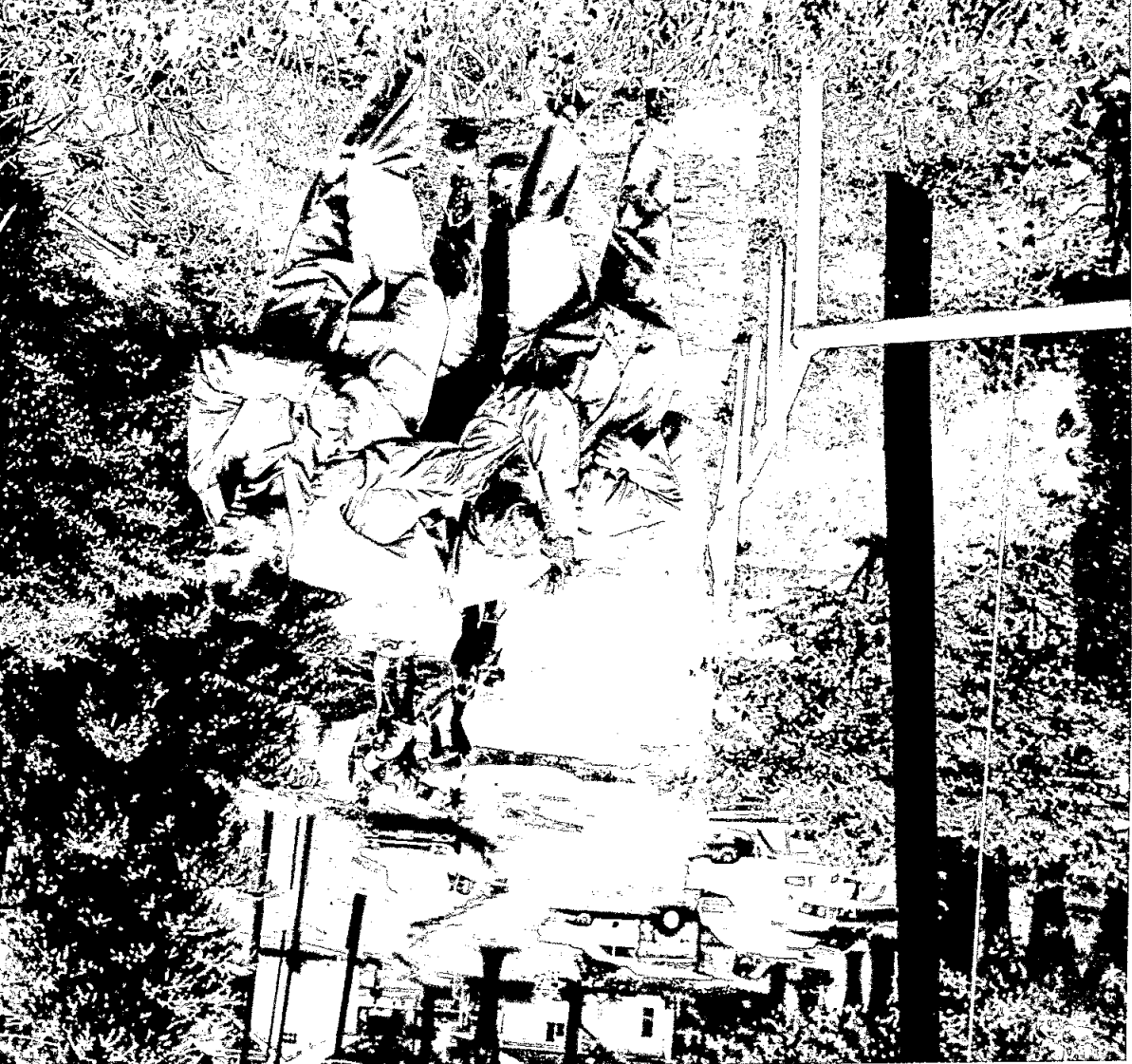
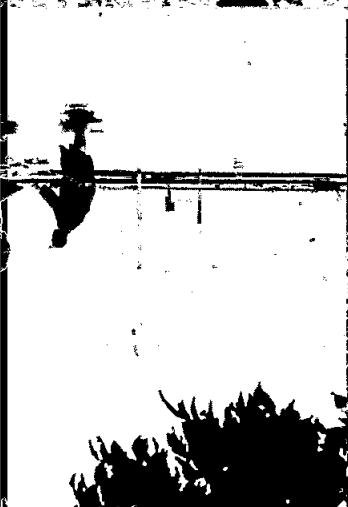
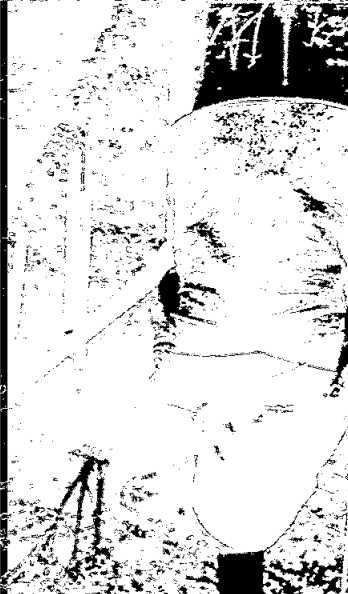
