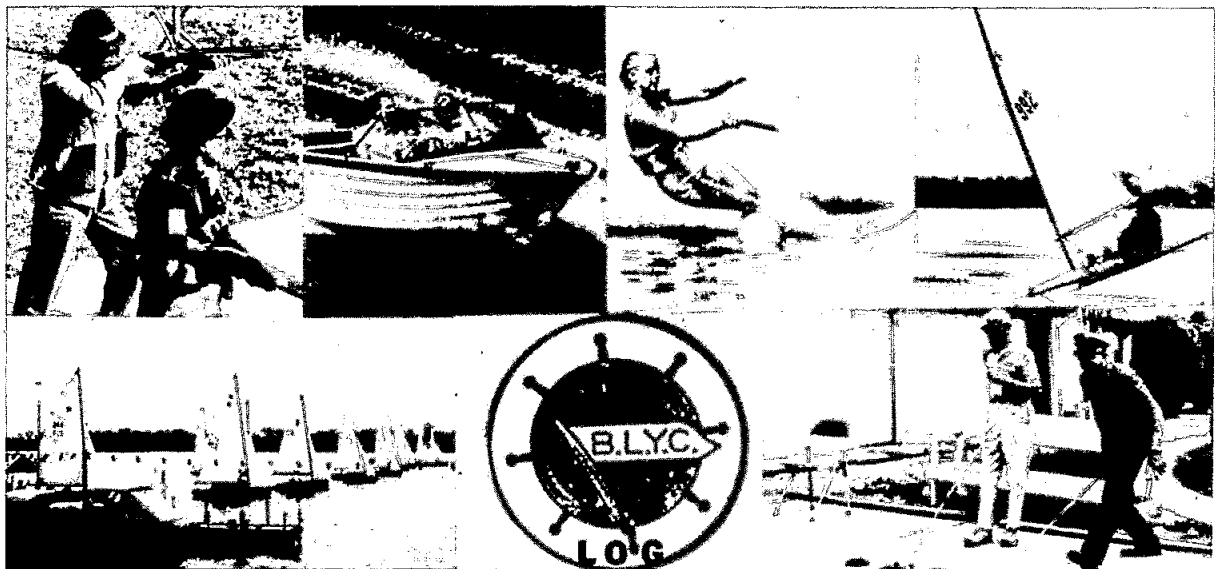

LET'S START A "CAT" CLASS AT BLYC: Last fall a new boat appeared at the Club. Shark, a 20' x 10' catamaran (US 373) with 275' sail area, the fastest growing catamaran class in the country. Shark is the only full sized class B catamaran that has a solid cockpit rather than a trampoline. The large, roomy cockpit (10' x 8'-3") is ideal for day sailing and the catamaran's natural stability is great for small children. In competition, Shark is the second fastest class in the US today. Only Tornado, a small cockpit, light trampoline catamaran will take her. Here is a boat that goes well to weather, screams on a reach and yet is docile to handle. Trailering is a cinch. Remove one bolt and she folds her hulls to 5'-3" on the road. Current area Yacht Clubs with Shark classes include Mentor, Lake Erie, Sandusky, Port Clinton and North Cape at Monroe, Michigan. Next summers activities include a continental Shark Championship at Mentor and the Shark Nationals at Sandusky.

Anyone interested, please call or write Rudd McAllister, 4332 Harborough Road, Columbus, Ohio 43221, phone 614/451-3321, and he will send you Shark brochures. His Shark is stored in Westerville where the hulls can be spread and folded on the trailer and is available for inspection.
