JUNIOR TRAINING: Buckeye Lake Yacht Club will again send a Junior Team of four members to represent our Club in the Sears Cup $\frac{1}{4}$ Finals held at Put-in-Bay Yacht Club the 28th thru the 31st of July. The Team is comprised of (1) one skipper, (2) two crewmen, and (1) one alternate.

To participate in the above event, the Junior sailor must be 13 years old by May 1, 1969, and not older than 17 years by September 1, 1969. In order that we best choose the most proficient sailors, two complete try-out events are planned. The first three skippers of this try-out series of races will be chosen. The purpose of the above series is to choose the best three skippers only. The two crewmen and alternate are not involved at that time and will not be selected from this first try-out.

We will use our Flying Junior sailboats in a round-robin series of races. Each skipper will have one crewman. No spinnakers will be used in this series.

Those Junior sailors interested in the above try-out for skippers MUST contact Gov. Jim Dressel before June 1, 1969, to be eligible.

The selection of the two crewmen and alternate will be made from the second try-out series. Details of this series will be given the three winning skippers after each have qualified.

Please contact Gov. Dressel before June 1, 1969, if you are a Junior sailor and wish to try-out for skipper.

CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES: The members were requested to approve the changes in the Constitution at the Semi-Annual meeting held May 4, 1969. These changes proposed were mailed to the whole membership in the issue of the LOG prior to the meeting so all of you know about them. They were approved, and the Club Constitution will now be reprinted with the changes made a part. This will be prepared, and hopefully mailed out with the new 1969 Club Roster. We feel this now brings the instrument up to date with the times and number of members in the Club. Your questions are welcomed on any part of the revisions which were made. This revised Constitution is now effective, and all the changes approved are in full force and effect.

STATE DOCK TAX - 1969: The Governors were given a shock the other day by The State of Ohio! The dock taxes for our dockage has been running at \$810.00 for 1968, and \$830.00 for 1967. The present Budget (\$800.) was made up in October, 1968, in full accord with the Club By-Laws, and the schedule of fees and charges were made according to last year's dock tax. We were told that we owed Ohio \$1,079.50 this year!! This is as you see, a \$279.50 increase over our budget. Article V, Section 6 clearly states that these taxes imposed shall be due and payable in addition to and together with such fees, dues, rentals and other charges. Therefore, it has been the sad duty of the Treasurer to issue bills for those members renting facilities. This is only \$3.00 additional per slip/boat house.

Excerpts from Commodore's Statements of Semi-Annual Meeting 5/4/69

"It's a fact of life.....and common knowledge to all of us...including the Board of Governors....that problems arise which must be faced head on and situations occur that must be dealt with. Choices must be made continually in everyday living and in the Board's conduct of Club business.... If you are driving out to the Club on the freeway, and some nut pulls out in front of you, you simply cannot continue in the same direction in which you had been driving. You must turn either left or right. Your sizing up of the situation will determine the course and timing of your turning the wheel, and it will only be a short time before you realize whether your choice was the correct one. Situations at the Club are rarely of this emergency nature, and our Board deserves commendation for the serious thought and full discussion given to Club problems....especially this year's bar 'hang up'. At times their commitment to get to the bottom of the problem and to avoid hasty action causes impatience in some. But in good time, exercise of judgement in the full light of every factor that can be uncovered is made and decisions will continue to be made in this fashion! The Board came into office with a known, tremendous obligation to make a decision that, however it went, would affect the whole complexion of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. This took courage!!! and a lot of work in putting together a concensus of the Club in the most acceptable way to run our bar. Losing two of the original Governors, Ken Merrill and Dean Volmer, put an added strain on the Board. They weathered this adjustment, and are proceeding in the administration of the Club effectively, with the vacancies filled by two good men -- Governor DeMary and Governor Embrey.

We welcome your criticisms. However, we also respectfully solicit your ___ideas for solution, or alternatives for our study and deliberation.

I thank this Board for their cooperation to date, particularly to S-T Beeson, for his untiring devotion to duty which he goes above and beyond! and we cannot now sit back and let the Club run itself all Summer. We will continue to take action required in the course of administering Club Affairs in your behalf. And you, the members, have our heartfelt thanks for your support and cooperation in helping us to keep this the finest Club anywhere!!!!"
