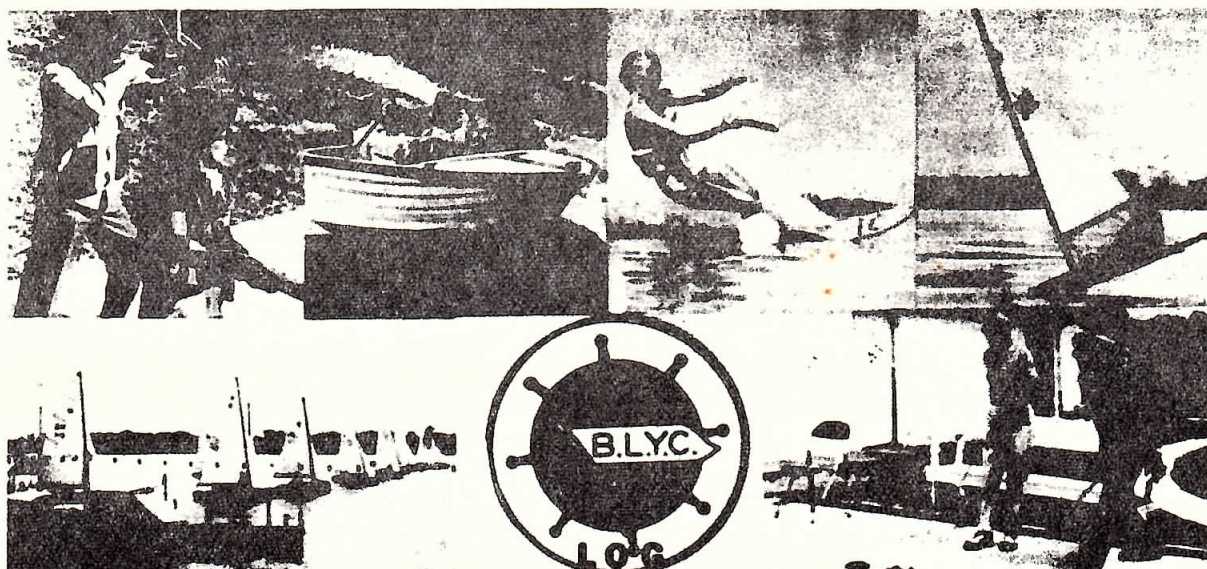

During the Regatta, all of the BLYC group, except for the Dressels, flew to Bariloche, Argentina for a few days. This is a ski resort with mountain ranges similar to the Swiss Alps and is quite beautiful. They all seemed to think this was the place they most enjoyed.

After the Regatta was over and all had toured Buenos Aires and the surrounding Gaucho country, the plane flew all to Rio de Janeiro for four days.

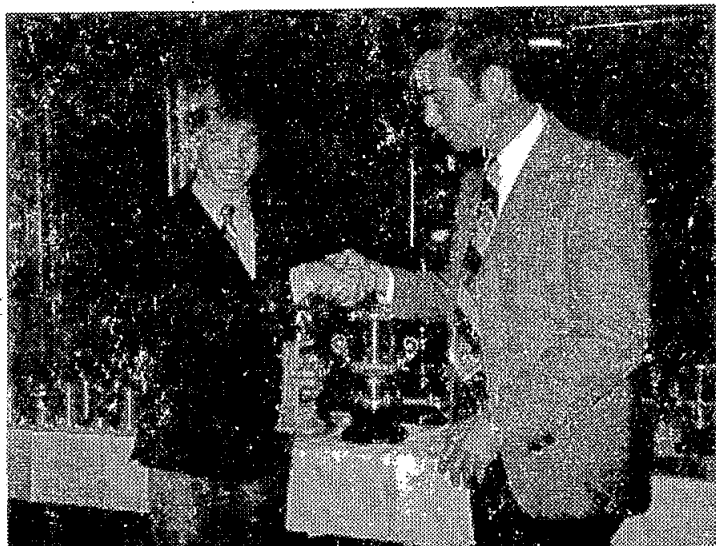
