Grant Avenue - 228-3535 FACILITY ASSIGNMENTS - Occasionally certain problems come up pertaining to the equitable assignment of slips. To more clearly define the guidelines which the Facility Assignment Governor will follow, the Board requested me to form a committee to set these rules down in writing. This committee was composed of Governors Dressel and Ballenger, PC Metzger and myself. These rules were formally approved at the March board meeting. We hope they will result in an equitable slip assignment method and avoid any confusion that may arise in the future.

SWAPPING OF SLIPS: The swapping of slips will be handled as if they are 2 new assignments. Each slip involved in the swap cannot be subject to another member's prior request which is on hand at the time the Governor in charge is notified in writing of the proposed swap. If the instituter of the swap wants another slip, he must submit his request in writing for a slip in that area. This same procedure must also be followed for the other slip involved. If no member is waiting for either slip, then the swap may be approved.

SLIPS WHICH ARE VACANT FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF TIME: All boats must be launched by JUNE 1st or the governor in charge has the right to TEMPORARILY re-assign the slip. A rental charge will be made to the temporary occupant of the slip on a pro-rata basis, and the permanent owner of the slip will be charged the annual rental for the consideration of his still having the right to the slip at any time. If the permanent owner of the slip does not launch his boat by the following JUNE 1st, the governor in charge shall have the right to PERMANENTLY re-assign the slip. Both the temporary and permanent re-assignment of the slip shall be made at the discretion of the governor in charge who shall take into consideration any extenuating circumstances.
