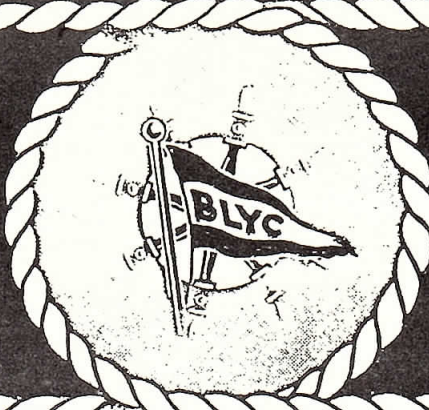

A mink cape is being raffled off by the Ladies Auxiliary, drawing to be held at our card party on June 17. Chances on the cape are available from any member.

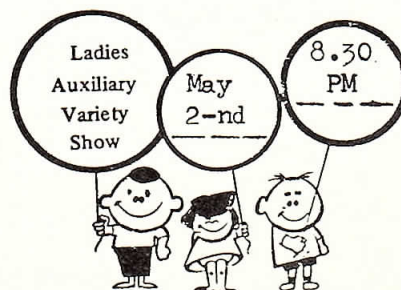
The May 2 date for our Spring Party is drawing near -- hope all the performers are rehearsing diligently!

This coming season B.L.Y.C. is again going to have a very active junior instruction program. We have engaged a fine young man to teach our young sailors this summer - Charles "Chip" Ballough - who is a student at O.S.U. Chip is from Atwood Lake where he is an active Highlander sailor (also Chip has skippered a flying junior boat on the O.S.U. Sailing Team for the past two years). We're all looking forward to the coming summer and I'm sure our young people will be eager to start the sailing season.

A few new ideas will be included in our 1970 program. Just a brief resume of the changes are: classes will be limited in size so as to allow ALL participants in the class to be out in the boats sailing--- there will be a new class for the advanced sailors. This new class will be called "Master Sailor" and will have a racing program included in it along with rule and tactics instruction.

Again this year B.L.Y.C. will send a Junior Team of four members ages 13-17, to represent our club in the Sears Cup quarter finals, held at Put-In-Bay Yacht Club in July. This is quite an honor for our young people to represent us and our club. I'm sure all of our young sailors will be looking forward to this event. Tryouts, etc., for this series will be announced at a later date.

We would like to encourage all B.L.Y.C. juniors, aged 7 and up, to participate in our '70 program - you won't want to miss it!
