FIRE AND CASUALTY FUND: The present status of this Fund is growing with the addition of interest and dividends since its inception at the Annual Meeting of the Club held September 17, 1967. This money cannot be used for any other purpose other than to make certain NEEDED repairs and is appropriately called FIRE AND CASUALTY LOSS FUND. This is to be mandatory budgeted item for ten years, and we have recently received the third payment from the Club for deposit to the Fund. The current value of this Fund now stands at \$4,756.26\* You can be proud for having set this money aside for the prospect of a disaster at our Club.
