BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING HI-LITES! Would you be

accepting applicants for PERPETUAL MEMBERSHIP and have  
set the fees according to the bylaws. The bylaw  
referring to LIFE MEMBERSHIP has been amended by  
proper action, and the wording follows in this item  
for your information. ANYONE INTERESTED SHOULD CON-  
TACT THE COMMODORE OR SECRETARY-TREASURER.

\*\*\*\*\*  
(reference BLUE BOOK: 1969, Pages 13 and 27) (REVISED/  
AMENDED)

1. Article I, Section 3:  
"Life Members, wherever referred to in these by-  
laws, shall mean PERPETUAL Members and shall have  
the same qualifications as ACTIVE Members, and  
are entitled to the same privileges as those for  
ACTIVE Members."
2. Article V, Section 2:
  - (a) Life Membership in the Club shall be con-  
sidered the equivalent of PERPETUAL MEMBER-  
SHIP. This class membership will be offered  
only to ACTIVE MEMBERS in good standing.
  - (b) The fee shall be equal to an amount sufficient  
to yield the then current dues and capital  
improvements charge (if any) at the rate of  
6% per annum.
  - (c) The fee shall be promulgated annually as pro-  
vided in Section 5 of this Article. The full  
amount shall accompany the application for  
such membership.
  - (d) The fee shall be deposited at once by the  
Club Secretary-Treasurer in THE BUCKEYE LAKE  
YACHT CLUB ENDOWMENT FUND. Income to be used  
for the operation of the Club, subject to the  
will of the Governors.
  - (e) Perpetual Members shall be subject to the fees  
for rental, reservation or use of Club facili-  
ties as provided in Section 4, Paragraphs (a),  
(b) and (c) of this Article.
  - (f) The surviving widow of a deceased PERPETUAL  
MEMBER who was in good standing at the time of  
his death, shall retain the same privileges at  
the Club to which she was entitled prior to

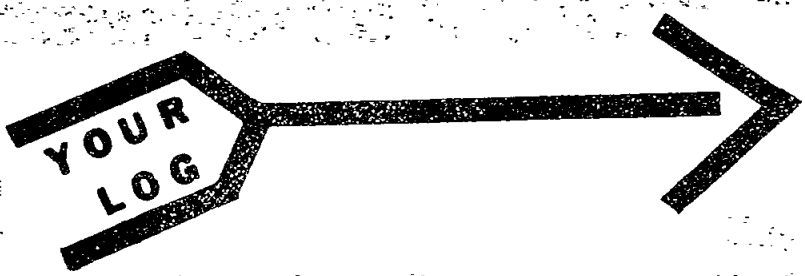
