STATE OF THE LAKE

THE CHEMICAL STATUS OF THE WATER OF BUCKEYE LAKE

On Saturday and Sunday, the 6th and 7th of October, a number of water samples were taken from the lake at the Yacht Club. The water of the lake was found to be slightly acid. This would be consistent with past reports. The lake was formerly an acid bog, and this acid condition has continued to the present.


The oxygen content was eight parts dissolved oxygen per million parts water. This high amount of oxygen shows why the lake is well noted for its fishing. In a highly polluted lake, the dissolved oxygen is usually down around zero.


It was surprising to find that the total amount of phosphate in the water was only three milligrams per liter. This is a fairly high amount, but not what was expected with the amount of detergent suds floating on the surface of the water during the past month. The reason for the low test is probably because of the acid condition of the lake water.


Carbon dioxide gas in the water was found at a fairly high level of ten milligrams per liter of water. This would also contribute to the acid condition found in the lake.


The chemical test for ammonia showed point seven milligrams per liter of water. This is a fairly low level and shows that the lake is not being overly polluted with raw sewage. This type of sewage is being treated before the affluent is dumped into the lake or its tributaries. The one concern is the abundance of detergent in the lake water. There must be a number of open drains from kitchen sinks and from washing machines pouring detergents directly into the lake without treatment.

Over all, the chemical status of the lake water looks good!


























COMMODORES ASSOCIATION
