

THE AMERICAN COOT

Many members of the Yacht Club have noticed a slate-gray, duck-like bird swimming around the docks of the Club. They usually think of it as a duck, but interestingly enough it is not. Ornithologists place this bird in the same order as the cranes and rails.

To distinguish this bird from ducks, even though it swims somewhat like a duck, it looks more like a chicken when it is walking around on land. When you see one out on the ground, look carefully and you will find that it has lobed feet, not webbed feet.

This bird migrates to the south during the winter, so by the time this report reaches you, this bird will not be seen around the Club until next spring. The Buckeye Lake individuals probably nest on Cranberry Bog and the cattail-water lily areas around the edges of the Lake. The nest is made attached to water weeds, and the female lays a dozen or more light brown eggs. She begins to incubate the eggs as they are laid, so the young are born over a number of successive days. The male takes care of the black downy chicks, which start swimming a few hours after leaving the egg, until all are hatched.



The coots feed primarily on submerged aquatic plants, but at times will eat animals, such as

snails, and insects. Coots are eaten by man, and they are hunted along with ducks under Federal hunting regulations.


