

### **GUN CLUB**


Ed Shinn, President

# STATE OF THE LAKE

#### BLUE-GREEN ALGAE

One of the groups of algae found in impounded bodies of water are the blue-greens of the Phylum Cyanophyta. They differ from all other algae in that they lack an organized nucleus and have their pigments spread throughout the cell. Like all algae they contain the pigment chlorophyll, necessary for the biological process, photosynthesis, but their cells also contain the pigment phycocyanin which is blue in color.

For the most part, the many species of this group are microscopic and must be viewed with a microscope. They may be found as individual cells imbedded in a jelly matrix or as a filament of round cells connected together.

For those of us who obtain our drinking water from impounded water sources (lakes and reservoirs) we are sometimes very aware that the blue-greens are present. During the spring of the year, when the water starts to warm, these algae go on a reproductive rampage, which phycologists call a "bloom". In a short period of time (24 hours or so) they can multiply thousands of times and the water will look like thick green soup. The blue-greens produce oils which they release into the water and make it smell fishy and taste awful. These oils are toxic and in large concentrations have been fatal to animals drinking the water.


