JUNIOR TRAINING PROGRAM AT BLYC PAYS OFF



After applying the time correction factor used when boats of different classes are competing in the same race, Matt Fisher was given first place, George Fisher, second place and Petersilge, third place.



STATE OF THE LAKE

THE GREEN ALGAE

The green algae, members of the Phylum Chlorophyta are the most diverse of the algae-like organisms and make up the largest group.

They are found in both fresh and salt water. They vary in size from microscopic single cells to a few a foot or so long. They have their cell walls composed of cellulose, they manufacture sugar by photosynthesis and their cells contain the green pigment, chlorophyll. For these three reasons they are thought to have given rise to the more advanced plants.

In freshwater they are of many forms. They may be part of the plankton organisms and along with the blue-greens give the water a greenish color. Many are filamentous and are found attached to rocks and other objects in the water. One of the common forms is referred to as "moss" by the fishermen as they get their hooks entangled in it. Many of the green algae contain other pigments besides chlorophyll and grow in unusual places. One of these grows at the Yacht Club. If you go out in front of the Club and look at the concrete wall along the dock you will see little orange dots. This green algae is Trentepohlia. Another group grows only on the shells of turtles.

The green algae are beneficial to man. They make up an important part of the environment of a body of water, in which they serve as food and shelter for many small animals.

Matt Fisher and Jeff Metzger were seeded with the first 15 crews for the United States Youth Championship (20 years and under) being held June 17th through June 23rd at the North American Yacht Racing Union Sailing Center on Association Island, Henderson Harbor, New York. There is also being conducted an open qualifying series to select another 10 crews for the Championship Series for a total of 25 boats. Buckeye Lake Yacht Club is very proud of the fact that Matt and Jeff were chosen and it is certainly an honor to be seeded in the top 15. These sailors are being selected from all over the United States from California to New York. There will be 7 races on Olympic courses. The winner of this series then will participate in the Youth Championship of the World in Spain, against the other countries throughout the world for the Youth Championship.

This is the same Championship that Greg Fisher and Holly Petersilge participated in last year in Chicago.

Jim Dressel with his wife, Nancy and Greg Fisher, won the Salem Regatta in Ecuador, South America. Jim and his crew were chosen to represent the United States along with one other crew (three time world's champion - Tom Allen) and they raced against representatives from the countries in South America. The regatta was quite an experience for Jim, Nancy and Greg and certainly an honor for themselves and the Club that they came in first and with such finishes as four, first and one second.

This same crew, the week-end before they left for South America, won the Great Lakes Championship for Lightings at North Cape Yacht Club on Lake Erie. Matt Fisher with a crew of Steve Roshon and Karen Albers came in third.

Prior to this, Jim Dressel won the Lighting Regatta at Detroit beating the World's Champion. Bruce Goldschmidt, in a head to head match.

Jim and Nancy just came back from the Buffalo Invitational Regatta where they raced against 47 Lightings at Buffalo Canoe Club and they won all of the races to make a clean sweep. So far this year, Jim and Nancy have entered in four regattas against top competition and have won all four.

Greg Fisher with a crew of Gwen Petersilge won the Lighting Regatta at Indianapolis against 37 boats. Greg and Gwen also sailed in the Olympic Training Regatta at Sandusky where they finished 6th out of 40 hot 470s, which is certainly a fine showing.






