It was discussed what to do with money in the treasury and it was approved by the women and the men to purchase card table chairs and a dryer.

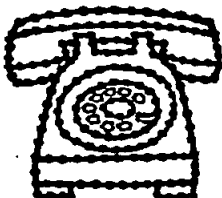
The centerpiece was won by Mariise Cruikshank.

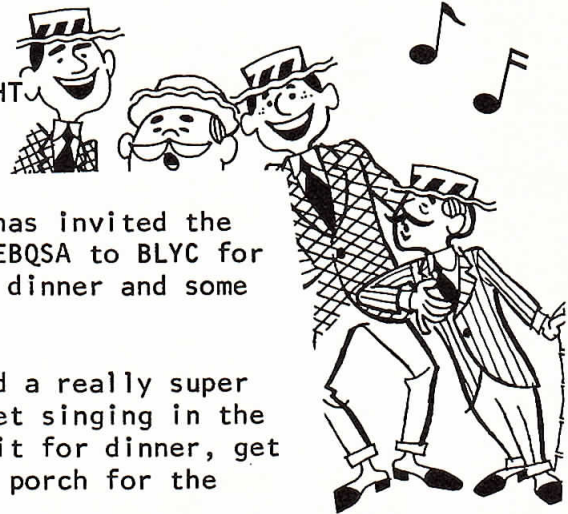

SAILING

The members of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club and your Race Committee Chairman are fortunate in having many members who are interested enough in Sunday Races that they give of their time and the use of their power boats to man the Race Shack, set the marks and provide rescue service. Jack Beeson is out there over half of the time. Walter Rosshirt, Ira Korst, P.C. Metzger, P. C. Limes, Rear Com. Preston, Gov. Tom Greiner and Gale Roshon have all been right in there several times.

June has seen racing every Sunday with Venture fleet being our most consistant participants. They have had six to nine boats starting every Sunday at 1:20 P.M. We have had wind and more wind this month, usually 10 to 20 mph with many gusts to 36 and 40 mph. We have seen Ventures with their mast tips in the water, only to pop back up again. Some say you can't turn 'em' over, but DeBenedictus says he doesn't believe that. Hudgins, Beck and Miller have had a chance to hear the "first over gun" go off for them.

We know you can turn Highlanders over and we have had days the Highlanders just did not choose to run. Out of six Highlander races in June, Moyer finished first four times and Masheter twice.

THE FOURTH OF JULY, 1974 ---got off to a Bang with the firing of the half hour gun at 10:00 A.M. by Jack Beeson. Through the team approach, this coincided with paying respect to our Country and its Flag by a simultaneous playing of the National Anthem (record supplied by Chuck Moyer) and the raising of the Stars and Stripes, along with the appropriate State and Club Flags by the Juniors Mike Hein, Dan Roshon, Lonnie Moyer and Willy Petersilge (Coached by P.C. Limes).

The first Highlander to cross the line was Masheter, followed by Frank Bentz and Walter Grubb all within the next minute. That's seven boats over in less than two minutes! Who says sailboat racing is not exciting enough for spectators?

Here comes another Lightning skippered by Steve Roshon. Then Cartwright's Highlander followed by Holly Petersilge in a Lightning. That's ten boats in six minutes, the next four boats were Highlanders, Chuck Moyer, Glenville Thomas, Chrisman and Hafer.

The first Venture to cross the line was Bob Hudgins followed by Dan Howland. Now comes a lone 470 on its Maiden Voyage with Mike Hein (age 11 yrs) as skipper and Steve Wachtel (age 12 yrs) as crew. They were followed in by seven not to be named sailors.

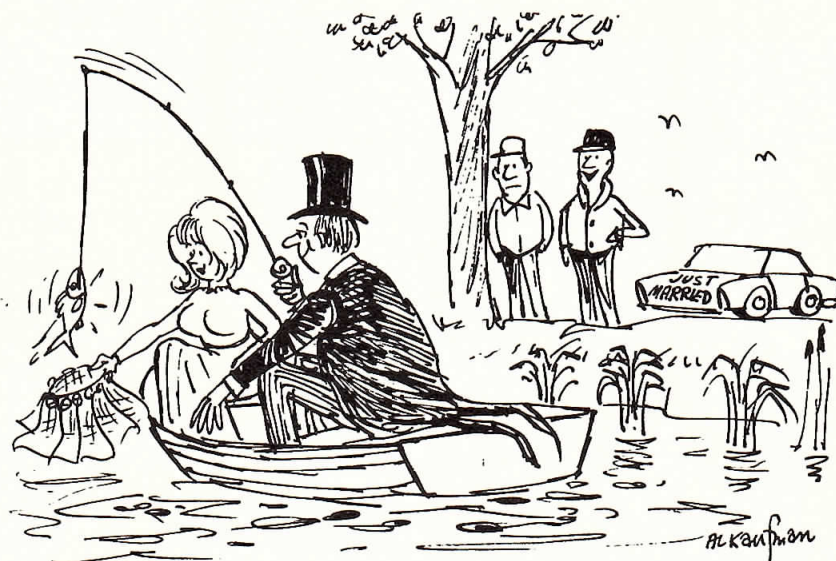




NOTEWORTHY
