

#### LABOR DAY LONG DISTANCE -- MULTI-CLASS RACE

Labor Day 1975 was a breezy day with winds recorded at 7 to 13 knotts. About 27 sail boats got off to a beautiful race. The first boat to cross the finish line was a Highlander with Chuck Moyer at the helm. Next came a Lightning skippered by Dan Roshon and then Walter Grubb in his Highlander. They were followed by Willy Petersilge in a Lightning. Next was Mike Hein in his Lightning and a while later, Matt Fisher in one of those little speedy Lasers you may have seen flitting around the lake this summer.

When it came time to pick up trophies, Chuck Moyer and Walter Grubb were left standing on the porch because when the handicaps and wind speed, etc., are run through a computer, it came out that first place, and the Dwight Haggard Trophy, went to Dan Roshon, second place to Willy Petersilge and third place to Matt Fisher.

#### REGULAR RACING SEASON

The regular Buckeye Lake Yacht Club racing season wound up in mid September after a total of 87 races were recorded for the four fleets. The activity of the fleets is reflected by the fact that the Lidos had 31 races, the Ventures 22 races, the Highlanders 20 races and the Lightnings had 12 races. These races were supervised by a Race Committee of eight members. Over three-fourths of the time, one of these members was Jack Beeson. Others who have worked to make this possible include Ira Korst, Gale Roshon, Gov. Tom Greiner, V/C Bob Preston, Com. Howard Limes, Com. Ed Metzger and Com. Mike Hein. We are also indebted to Lou Cartwright for maintaining the audio equipment.

#### MASTER CUP SERIES

As the Log goes to press, the Master Cup Series is being run off. Each fleet sent two representatives this year to a sail off held in Ventures. The group was divided into an A and a B series with the top two of each series to have a final four race Round Robin. At this time, the first elimination series has been completed with the following results:
