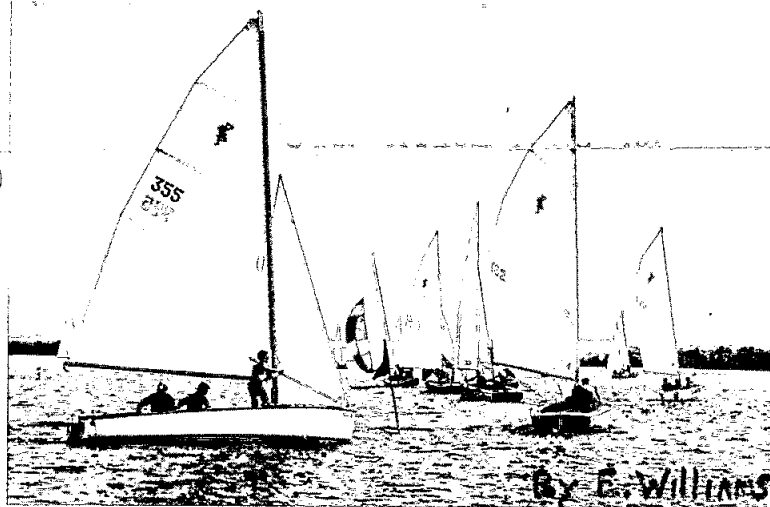

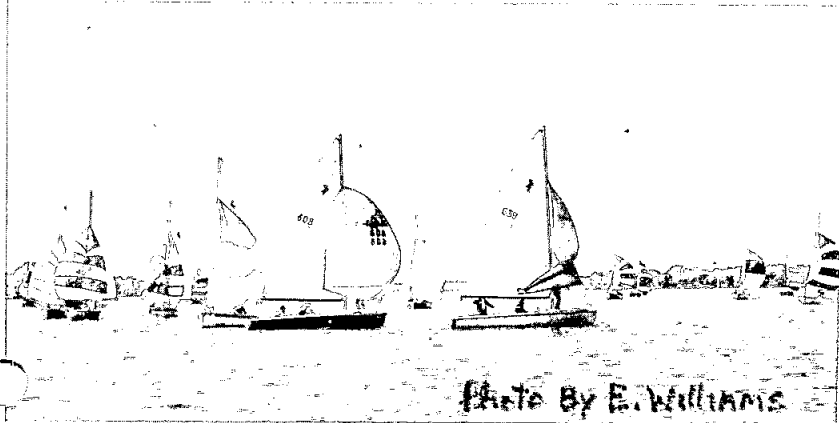

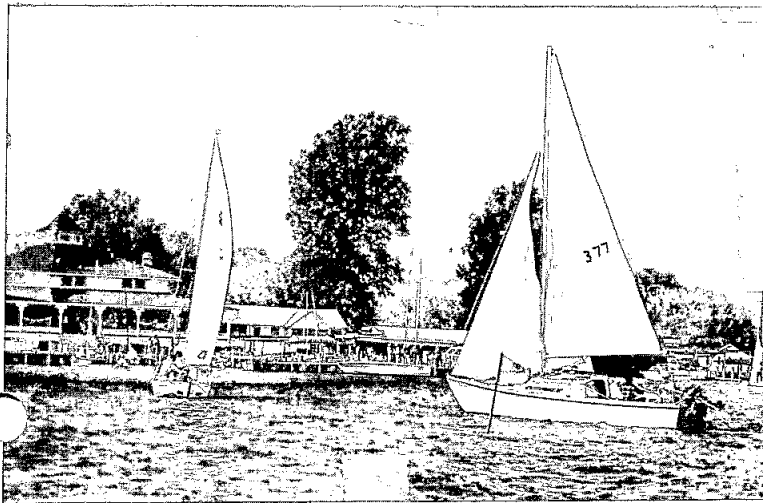


M. HEIN II LEADS RACE 2 1/2 LAPS

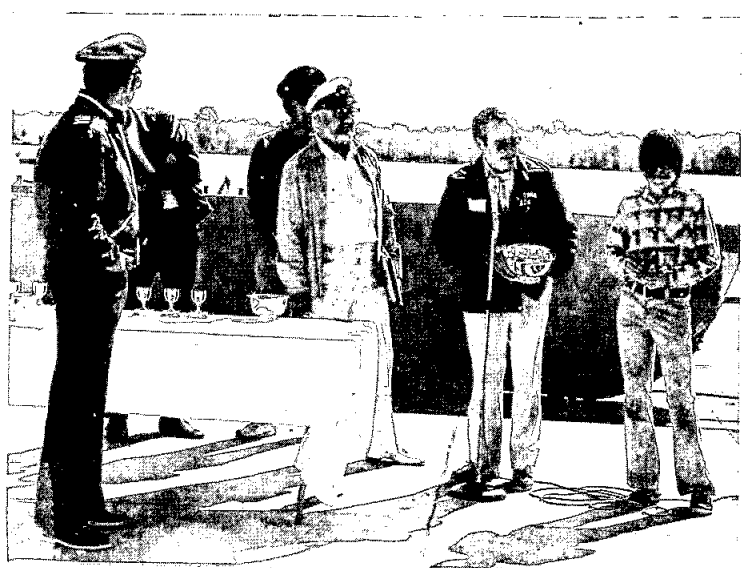

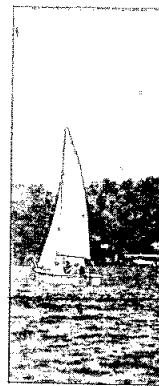

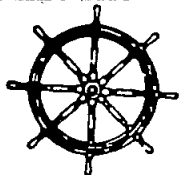
We are pleased to announce that plans are in the mill for a boat tour to Marietta in late May. The firm date will be made available at a later meeting.
