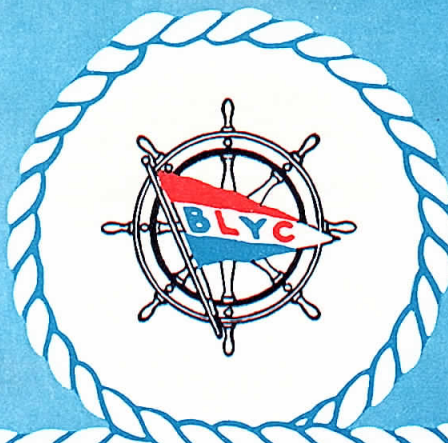

## THE SWEETHEARTS BALL

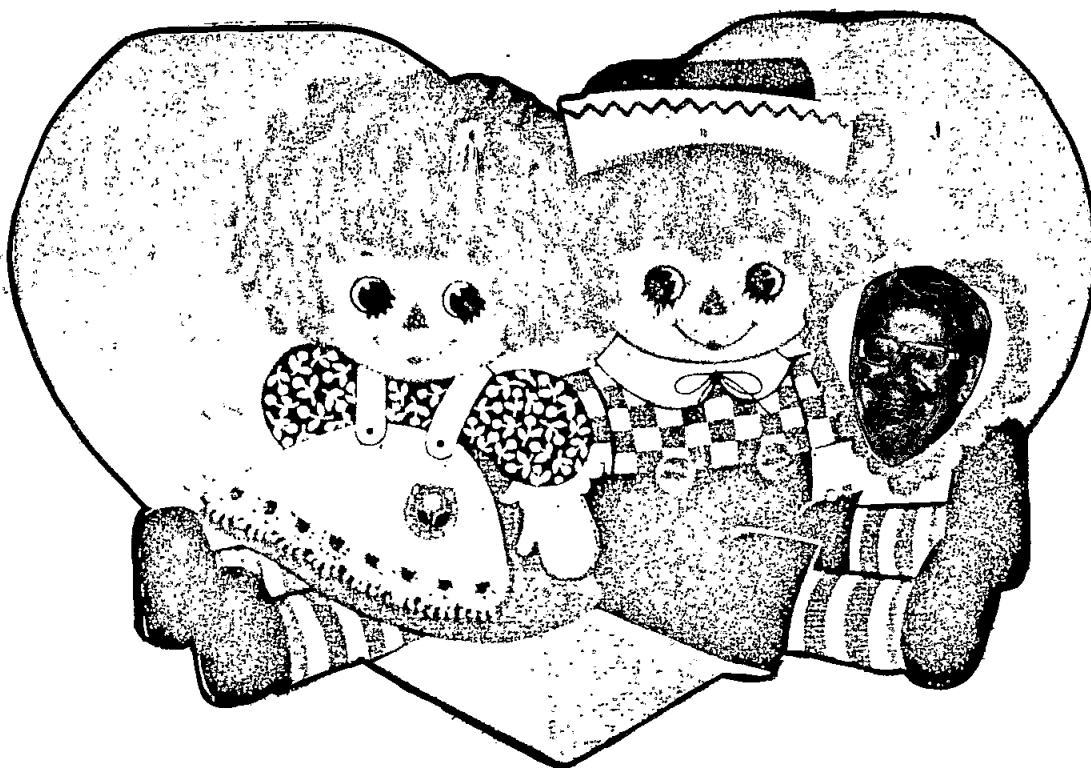
