

FACILITIES

DOCK AND STORAGE RULES

Paragraph 4 a. provides "A list of slip applications and date of priority will be published semi-annually in the Log and maintained continuously on the bulletin board."

b. provides "All slip assignments, both new and transfers, will be posted on the bulletin board."

Paragraph 2 provides "Assignment of docks or slips will be based on: a. Date of completed dock application form or letter."

There is now posted on the bulletin board a map of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club dock facilities as rent was paid for those facilities for the year 1975. There have been no changes or transfers since the end of the 1975 sailing year. There are now some facilities available. Assignment of facilities, other than those assigned and paid for in 1975 which will be billed again for 1976 at the same location, will be made according to Dock and Storage Rules as soon as we have a better idea of available facilities.

We encourage anyone who paid for facilities in 1975 who does not intend using them in 1976 to please advise the Governor in charge of facilities as promptly as possible, even in advance of payment of dues.
