## JUNIORS AGE 13 THROUGH 17

The sail off for a chance to represent BLYC in one, two, or three man I-LYA sponsored quarter finals at Port Clinton or Put-In-Bay will be held in Lasers starting the week of June 14th. Notify Governor Petersilge of intent to compete by Sunday, June 13th. (Preferably earlier) Boats will be loaned to juniors who do not have a Laser for the sail off.

## JUNIOR SAILING TRAINING

In order to have fun while learning to sail this summer, sign up for the sailing instruction for juniors and ladies. The course will consist of six weeks of instruction and sailing practice starting the week of June 14th. Six hours of instruction each week for six weeks, probably in two - three hour sessions. The schedule will be made up after the registrations are in. Classes will be offered for beginner, intermediate, experienced and advanced sailors and a ladies class. The course will include fundamentals of seamanship, safety, boat handling and boat maintenance.

The instructor will be Holly Petersilge. Matt Fisher has offered to work with the juniors selected to sail as BLYC representatives for the Smythe, Bemus and Sears Cup competitions. Classes are open to sons and daughters or regular girl companions or wives of members and juniors over 7 years of age. The fee will be \$35.00 per student. Call 344-1417 for further information.

## SAILING NEWS

The lack of water so far this season has hampered, if not completely postponed, as in the case of the Lido fleet, the entire racing faction. The Ventures have ventured out into the mill pond after adequate assurances from the mark setter that there was no shallow water on the course. The Highlander fleet will kick off the season Sunday, May 23rd with racing starting at 10:30 AM and the following Wednesday night starting at 6:45 PM.

Upcoming off-the-lake sailing for the Highlander fleet will include the Highlander Fling on June 26th and 27th at Hoover and a regatta at Cowan Lake on June 12th & 13th. The Lidos will start as soon as the present fleet captain (last year's fleet champion) and last year's runner-up can get their boats in the water. The Lightnings have been active off the lake with Jim Dressel taking a first at Indian Lake and another come-from-behind first at North Cape. Competing with Jim at Indian Lake was Willy Petersilge with a crew comprised of Tom Hudgins and Mike Hein II. Our contingent at North Cape included, besides Jim, George Fisher, Matt Fisher and Dan Roshon.

Upcoming events include the Niagara Frontier Regatta at Buffalo, New York on June 12th and 13th; a Thistle regatta at Mentor Harbor on June 19th and 20th. The Lasers started their Ice Breaker season on May 1st, will start their spring series (Saturday at noon) on June 5th and their Sunday series on June 6th. The Lasers have their storage racks installed so they are ready to go.

Upcoming events at the Club include regular Sunday morning and afternoon racing, Wednesday evening racing and the Memorial Day Long Distance Race on Monday May 31st. It will start at 11:00 AM with the 30 minute gun at 10:30 AM. There will be a triangular course, the position of the marks will be displayed on the chalkboard on the front porch. The finishing position will be based upon the Portsmouth formula. The 1975 ratings (for use in 1976 races) have not been published yet and the official word from U.S.Y.R.U. is that the 1975 race book is still in effect until the new book is published.
