LONN MOYER FIRST IN THE SMYTHE SEMI-FINALS

I-LYA and BLYC will be represented in the Smythe Finals at the Biscayne Bay Yacht Club in Miami, Florida where Lonn Moyer will have his try at the USYRU National Championship for single handed Junior Sailors. The races will be held August 30, 31, September 1, 2, 1976.

Last month the BLYC Log reported that Lonn had qualified for the USYRU sponsored Smythe Semi-Finals when he sailed at Port Clinton. This month, on August 9, 10, 11, Lonn sailed a Laser at the Semi-Finals at a small lake north west of Ann Arbor Michigan (Huron Portage Yacht Club) and brought home honor and glory to BLYC by getting into first place and holding in there to the finish to become the USYRU Area "E" Smythe Champion for 1976.

BLYC's three man team, Will Petersilge, Dan Roshon and Tom Hudgins took the Thistle to Put-In-Bay and sailed the Sears Cup Quarter Finals on August 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th. They sailed against 15 other clubs in six races the first two days to qualify for a place in the top five. Then they competed in the Round Robin for five races. In this series, they held second place from the second race through the fourth race, and finished the series in third place with 15-3/4 points. Cleveland Yacht Club finished in second place with 15 points and Mentor Yacht Club took a solid first place with 7-1/4 points.

Put-In-Bay dished out all kinds of weather during the series from ideal 8-15 mile per hour winds to drifters; on the last day there were 20-30 mph winds.

The team will have their names inscribed on the third place cup, a permanent trophy which will be stored and displayed from now on in the Marine Museum in Vermillion, Ohio. Incidently, the Museum is a fascinating place for visiting. Try it, you'll like it.























KITCHEN
