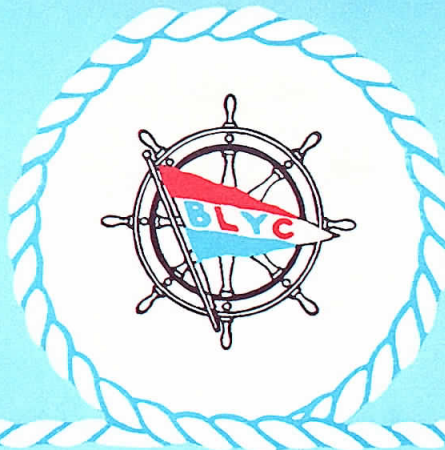

Bob Hudgins was also the winner in the Masters. Congratulations to all.

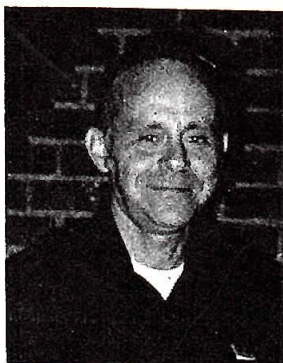
The Gun Club will soon commence firing; the Icebreakers are with us again, and many special events are planned during the winter season. Be sure to join in the fun and fellowship with your friends.

Beginning in November, the kitchen will be closed Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

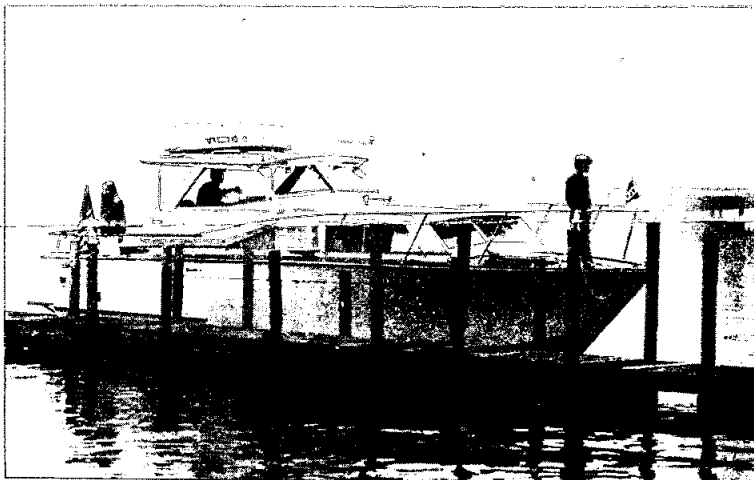

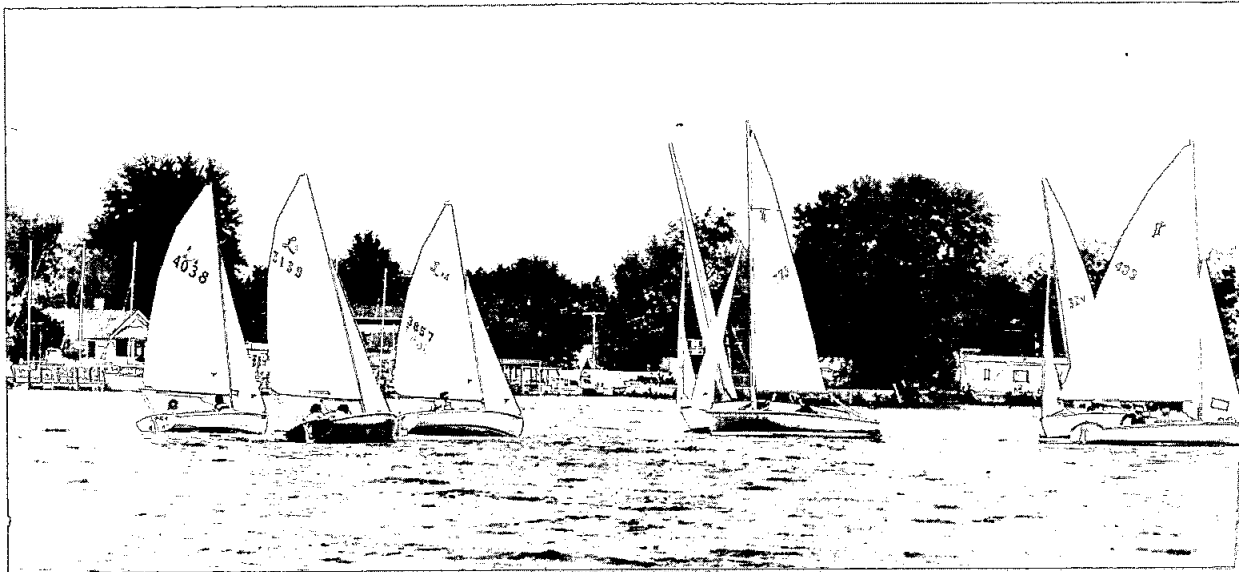
The month of October marked the culmination of sailing at the Club this year. The Ventures completed their final series on Sunday with George Beck's "Empathy" coming in first, Bob Wachtel's "Bob's Saxophone" second, and Bob Hudgins in "Relativity" coming in third. On Wednesday night the Ventures were won by Gordon Forster's "Blue Skies", second was Bob Hudgins' "Relativity" and third was Jeff Wagner in "Achilles".

Starting the month were the two Snowball Regatta weekends under the general chairmanship of Whittie Limes. It was a job "well done" Commodore. The first weekend saw Jerry Jones winning the Lido Snowball as well as the 7th District Lido Championship, Steve Beeson taking a second and Pete Polites coming in third. The Highlander results showed Tom Martin from Hoover coming in first, Earl Remen placing second and R. Spring with a third. The Lasers participated in their first Snowball this year with Willie Petersilge taking first place honors in the over-all. In the light-weight division (159# and under) Willie Petersilge was first, Charles Koontz was second, and Bob Hudgins was third. In the heavy-weight class (160# and over) George Fisher came through with first place honors, Lonny Moyer was second and Jim Dressel was third. The second weekend was devoted to the Lightnings and Ventures. The Lightning results came up with Matt Fisher in first place, Tom Allen in second and George Fisher in third. The Ventures were won by Bob Hudgins, Gordon Forster was second and Bob Wachtel had a third.

Following close on the heels of the Snowball Regatta was the Master Cup series. To those that are unfamiliar with this series, it is comprised of the fleet champion or the representative from each fleet of the Club. The class of boat is changed each year and it is a round robin series. The winner of the series earns the distinction of being the Club champion. This year it was a four race series which started on Saturday with three races on Saturday and one final race on Sunday. The contestants included Bob Hudgins from the Venture Fleet, Chuck Moyer from the Highlander Fleet, Willie Petersilge from the Lightning Fleet and Jerry Jones from the Lido Fleet. After the series which started out with light air on Saturday and wound up with relatively good air on Sunday was concluded, Bob Hudgins came through with a first, Willie Petersilge had a second, Chuck Moyer was third and Jerry Jones was fourth. This reporter has it on good authority however, that the winner had considerable help in this series, namely two crew members; one his son Tom and two, an unlimited supply of Ben-Gay. On off the lake sailing, Lonny Moyer competed in a Banshee Regatta in lower Michigan. There were six races of which Lonny took five firsts and a second. On the college scene, Greg and Matt Fisher represented Miami University in a college regatta at Iowa State. It was sailed in Flying Juniors, and in competition with 19 other teams, Greg and Matt upheld the Fisher tradition by taking firsts in both of the divisions they represented.

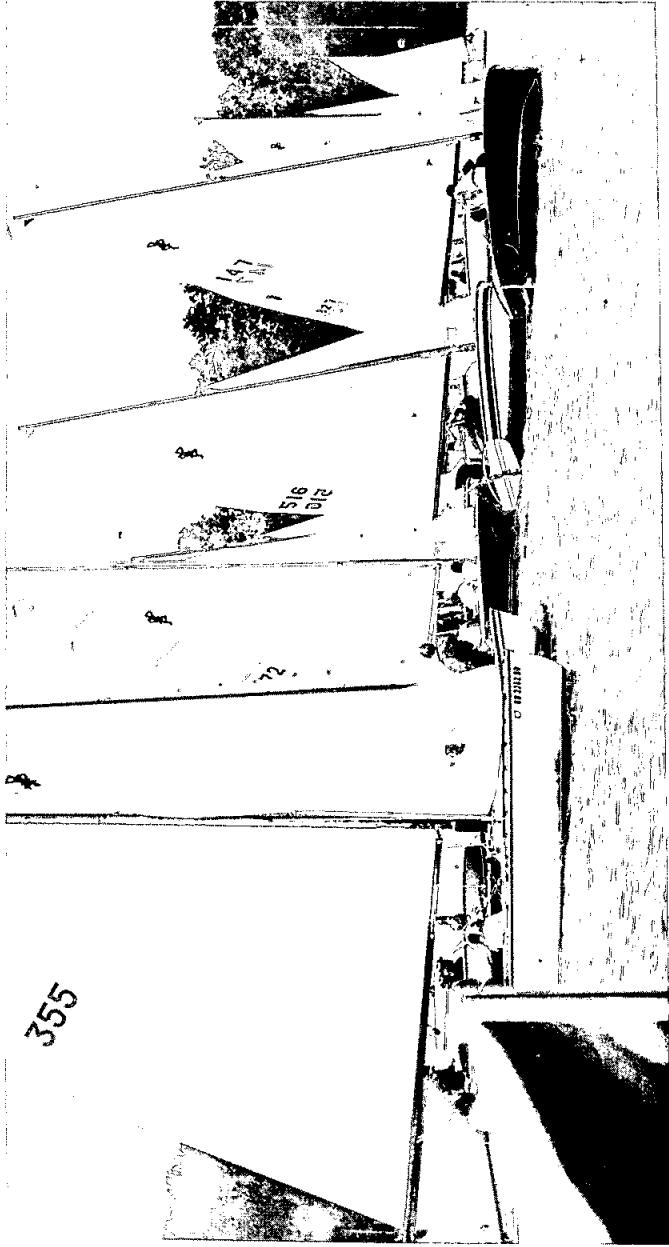
