SAILING

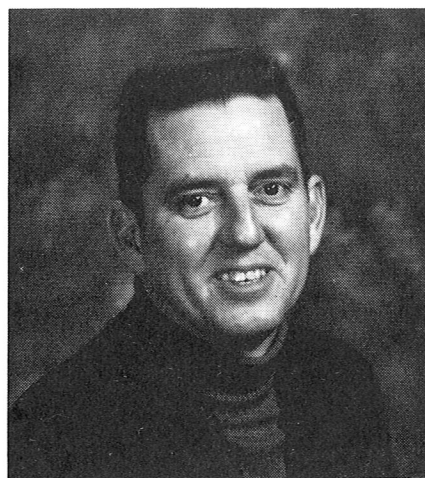

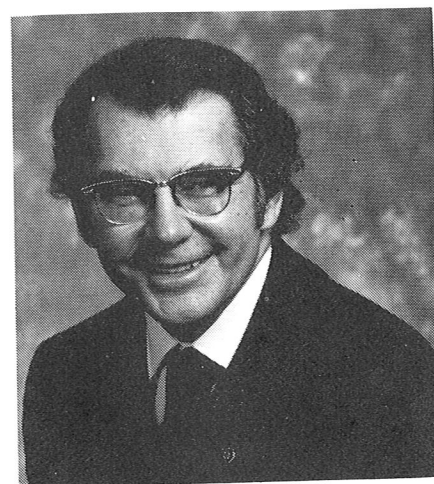
JUNIOR PROGRAM SAILING ALONG
