I ask you all to participate in the coming election and to give support to the new Board and to the new Commodore.



JUNIOR TRAINING

BLYC JUNIORS TAKE ALL THREE QUARTER FINALS

Will Petersilge, Dan Roshon and Dan Dressel sailed the quarter finals for the Sears Cup and joined the elite group of "I-LYA Champions From BLYC". The July Log reported that Lonn Moyer had taken first place again in the Smythe Quarter Finals, and Steve Beeson with Mike Hein as crew had won the Bemis Quarter Finals.

At Put-In-Bay, the BLYC Thistle sailed against 14 other boats from other Yacht Clubs and had a 5-6-2-1-1-1 in the sail off qualifying races. They then sailed a round-robin with four other boats for the "Sears Cup Quarter Final I-LYA Junior Sailing Championship", They had a 1-1-4-1-3 for nine and one-half points; Pymatuning had 13 points; Cleveland



This makes the fourth time that BLYC has won the I-LYA Sears Championship in the past six years, and the second time that Will Petersilge has skippered his crew into first place out of four attempts.

As usual, BLYC turned out a great cheering section at Put-In-Bay. We had 26 present for a "lawn party and supper" on Wednesday evening. BLYC FIRST AT SEARS SEMI-FINALS

From the I-LYA sponsored Sears Quarter Finals, BLYC's team went on to Buffalo Canoe Club for the USYRU Area "E" Sears Semi-Finals. Seven champion teams from seven yachting associations competed there in Lightnings. BLYC moved into first place after the third race and kept their lead to the end of the series to win the USRYU Area "E" Junior Championship. They had a 2-1-1-2-1-3-3 series. Will Petersilge with Dan Roshon and Dan Dressel as crew demonstrated super team work as they sailed against real competition. Their constant threat was a team from Winnetka (Chicago) Illinois, skippered by Adam Loory. (Adam Loory moved to the Chicago area from Leatherlips Yacht Club last winter. He had sailed against Will Petersilge at Put-In-Bay last year.) Winnetka had a 1-2-2-4-7-1-2 series. Notice that Winnetka finished ahead of BLYC three out of the seven races. The three days of racing at Buffalo Canoe Club provided all sorts of weather; moderate winds for races 1,2 and 3, light for race 4, very light for race 5, light for race 6 and brisk with $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ foot seas for the final race.

Will Petersilge, Dan Roshon and Dan Dressel will be representing BLYC and the I-LYA, plus Area "E", sailing for the National Junior Sailing Championship of the United States Yacht Racing Union at Rush Creek Yacht Club in Dallas, Texas from August 24th through 28th, 1977.





Lonn Moyer Takes Second In Smythe Semi-Finals

The Semi-Finals for the Smythe and Bemis Cups were both held at Cowen Lake in southern Ohio on Friday and Saturday, August 12th and 13th, 1977. BLYC had a representative team there for both competitions. Lonn Moyer sailed a Laser against ten competitors. The series was six races with one throw out. Lonn got a 2-9-1-3-3-2 which was good, but his competition got a 1-1-2-4-1-1 which was better. Devils Lake representative took home the championship cup. The air was quite light for the first three races on Friday and heavier but quite shifty for the three races on Saturday. Typical of the good sportmanship and comradship which takes place at these events is the fact that Lonn's victor from Devils Lake has invited Lonn to ride with him to Texas so Lonn can root for BLYC which will be sailing the Sears Final on the same lake at the same time at Rush Creek Yacht Club, Dallas, Texas.

Steve Beeson and Mike Hein who had won the quarter-finals for the Bemis at Port Clinton sailed the semi-finals at Cowan Lake the same time as Lonn Moyer. They had the same fluky air and found more dead spots than Lonn apparently, as they placed in the lower half of their series. Watch these boys however as they have next year to go after it again and they are getting a lot of experience behind them.




