Please mark you callendar for the Semi-annual Meeting, May 7th at 3:00 p.m. It would be nice to have a quorum for this important meeting.



OFFICICAL NOTICE - SPRING MEETING

The following amendment to the B.L.Y.C. Constitution will be submitted to the membership for approval at the spring meeting at 3 p.m., Sunday, May 7, 1978.

ARTICLE IV Section 2. (a) The membership shall consist of eight (8) classes: Active, Life, Honorary, Associate, Crew, Junior, and Non-Resident. (Original signed by 25 members eligible to vote and in good standing.)

The responsibilities and privileges of the ASSOCIATE and CREW memberships are defined in the following amendments of the By Laws which the Board of Governors will enact once the new classes of memberships are created.

Should you have any questions regarding these proposals, please contact Flag Officers or Governors.

ARTICLE I MEMBERS' QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVIGES

<u>Section 9 p.15</u> (a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least 21 years of age and less than 35 years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electorial Privileges.

- (b) Associate Members shall be required to pay one seventh of initiation fee upon application for membership and at least one seventh of that initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, initiation fee must be fully paid by the members' thirty-fifth birthday.
- (c) Associate Members may become active members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members Initiation Fee required at the time of their entry into Associate Membership.
- Section 10 (a) CREW MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, must be at least 21 years of age and must be invited to join the club and sponsored by an active member who is the owner or skipper of a sail boat regularly docked on Buckeye Lake. His application for CREW MEMBERSHIP must be endorsed by the majority of the active members of the fleet to which that sail boat belongs.
- (b) CREW MEMBERS PRIVILEGES shall be limited to COMMON PRIVILEGES as defined in sub-paragraph (a) of Section I of Article I hereof.
- (c) CREW MEMBERSHIPS shall be limited to two sailing seasons for any given person.

These amendments are supported by more than two-thirds of the Board of Governors.

It is traditional that the winning club at the ILYA sponsered Sears Quarter Finals host a Junior Sailing Symposium. We are planning to have this symposium at the club on May 6 and 7.

Jim Dressel will be the program chairman. I am sure that our program will be in keeping with the BLYC tradition.

Our guests will arrive Saturday morning and will leave at the conclusion of the program at noon on Sunday. Saturday night we need volunteers to provide housing for our guests. They are being instructed to bring sleeping bags, and we hope to keep them entertained at the club until bedtime.

BLYC JUNIORS! We hope you will all attend this program. It's a great chance to improve your sailing knowledge as well as meet and renew friendships with kids from other clubs. The registration fee is \$10.00 which includes Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast. Also, please don't forget that Sunday, April 16, is work day at the club. We need to get our gear ready for the coming season.

Details on sailing lessons will be in the May issue of the log. Now might be the time to talk to your non-member friends who might want to take our sailing courses. Their fee is only \$20.00 more than members' fees. This additional cost is for the use of the equipment. Lessons will start approximately the middle of June.

PETITION FAVORING A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE BUCKEYE LAKE YACHT CLUB

The BLYC Constitution provides that any proposed amendments must be in writing and signed by not less than twenty five (25) eligible and voting members in good standing.

It is proposed that the following two paragraphs be added to Article VII, Section 3 after the presently existing paragraph:

Each candidate or a person designated by him in writing may observe all activities and deliberations of the Judge and the three tellers, including the counting and judging of ballots, and may inspect all ballots. The Judge and the tellers shall safely retain all official ballots whether disallowed or not, for two weeks after the election and for such further time up to 3 months if so requested by any non-elected candidate.

In the event that there is a tie vote, so that nine members can not be declared elected, the Judge and tellers shall be charged with holding an impromptu runoff election at the annual meeting between the tied candidates to break the tie.
