JUNIOR SAIL OFF SET FOR WEEK OF JUNE 19, 1978

One of the most exciting events of our club sailing is the Junior "Sail Off" for positions to represent the club in Junior I-LYA competition for the Bemis, Smythe, and Sears Cups.

The Sail Off will start Monday, June 19, at 5:00 P.M. and run as many evenings as required to complete a Round Robin Series. Members of the committee, headed by Com. Geo. Fisher, will conduct the Sail Off and consider any protests. Decisions of the committee shall be final.

Entrants shall be expected to be able to skipper any one, two, or three-man centerboard one design boat in weather up to 25 MPH, and agree to represent BLYC in the Quarter, Semi-Final, or Finals for the Bemis, Smythe, or Sears Cup. The entrant must be at least 13, but not over 17 years old in 1978, and must have passed the Master Achievement tests or be able to demonstrate ability to pass this test to the satisfaction of some member of the Junior Training Committee.

During the Sail Off at BLYC, the Committee requests that a parent or some responsible adult be present to assist the junior committee and the entrant with the mechanics of the Contest - rigging and derigging boats, etc.

The Sail Off will be in Lasers - any contestant who cannot arrange to have a Laser there should contact some member of the Junior Committee for assistance in borrowing a boat. The parent of the contestant must assume responsibility for repair of any boat damaged during the Sail Off.


Don't forget to talk to your friends who may be interested in learning to sail - their parents need not be club members. (Non-members may not represent the club in I-LYA competition.)
