

#### ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL MEMBERS

The Board of Governors, with the approval of the Trustees, has voted to renovate the boat house area. Present boat houses will be demolished and new slips of 9, 10, and 11 foot widths will be constructed. The area will be roofed (but not enclosed) suitable for year-round storage of boats.

The estimated cost will be \$30-\$34,000. Rents for the new slips will be raised to \$350 to \$400 depending upon the width of the dock. The project is considered to be self-liquidating in five to seven years. Work will begin promptly and completed no later than Labor Day.

To finance this project, the Club will issue 34 promissory notes of \$1000 each payable in seven years. Each member shall have the privilege of buying one note before any other member is allowed more than one. Following the sale of all 34 notes, there will be a drawing to determine the order in which they will be repaid at the option of the Club with no penalties on early payment.

It is hoped that some notes can be retired each year; hopefully all within five years. The notes will be non-interest bearing; however, the special fund set up to handle the money subscribed, the income from the docks, and all other items of income and expense pertinent to this project will pay to the Club's General Account an amount of \$90 per year, or fraction thereof, for each outstanding \$1000 note. Said income to the Club may be appropriated as the Governors of the Club so direct.

If you are interested in purchasing one or more of these notes, please send your deposit check of \$100 to the Secretary/Treasurer, John Snyder, at the earliest time. Please indicate the number of notes you would like to have. If more than 34 notes are requested, each person will be allowed to buy additional shares in the proportion that his request (above one note) represents to the total of all requests (above one per member). In the event when the notes are finally written by the proper legal persons you may withdraw and receive your deposit return if you so wish.

Obviously the notes will be transferable to another member of BLYC. In the case of the demise of a member, they will become a part of his negotiable estate.

These notes will have first call on all assets of the Club as there is now no other outstanding indebtedness. Any other indebtedness which the Club may elect to undertake during the period of these outstanding notes will be subordinated to these notes that may remain unpaid at that time.

#### LOG ARTICLE

### LOG ARTICLE (Cont'd)

As discussed and accepted at the Spring Meeting, it is a payment plan to cover the initiation fee for new members between the ages of 21 to 35. These members must pay their annual dues and capitol improvement fees in full, but they are able to pay a minimum of \$50.00 per year toward their initiation fee. The question has been brought up about someone who might be 30 or 32 etc. In this case, the individual has as many years to pay the initiation fee as he has years left to his 35th birthday, i.e. a 30 year old would pay \$70.00 per year or \$350 divided by the number of years until the 35th birthday.

At this time, I want to make it clear that anyone joining under this payment plan for the initiation fee  $\underline{\text{DOES}}$   $\underline{\text{NOT}}$  qualify for the \$50.00 discount stated earlier. Only members paying their fees in full qualify for this discount.

The other point to remember is that the member joining under the special payment plan on initiation fees will not be able to vote or hold an office in the Club until his fees are paid in full. He may choose to pay these fees in full anytime he desires.

I would like to leave the thought with you that you get out of anything in life only what you put into it; BLYC is not an exception to this rule. Come on out, participate more, enjoy good friends; both you and the Club can benefit from this participation.

Bring your friends out, let them enjoy all we have to offer and I'm sure they will want to become a part of BLYC.

## SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING VOTES TO SUPPORT KITCHEN EXPANSION PROJECT

The Spring Membership Meeting was attended by 61 B.L.Y.C. members. Rear Commodore Petersilge reporting on the status of the Bar and Kitchen, pointed out that the first four months of 1978, the Bar and Kitchen had grossed 25% more than in the same period 2 years ago. This good news was shadowed, however, by the realization that the kitchen had several gross inadequacies — floor is rotting in several places with unsanitary floor coverings; dishwasher is not functional; mops and pans are washed in same sink; dirty dishes and food preparation are in same area; traffic in and out of kitchen is through the same door; refrigerator and freezer storage space is inadequate; salad, desserts, and meats are prepared on same small area; Junior members must place "short orders" at adult bar, etc. Some of these deficiencies have been noted by the Board of Health and corrections are mandatory if the kitchen is to be licensed.

These deficiencies are not new. They have been a concern of the Club for some time, and the report of the "Long Range Planning Committee" has included

recommendations that Kitchen Improvement be a priority item.

Vice Commodore Rollit then presented a recommendation that the Club undertake a Capital Improvement, involving \$20,000 to \$26,000 which would correct the kitchen deficiencies and expand the dining area. The kitchen would be extended behind the existing bar and have a second exit to the

expanded dining area.

The proposal received open discussion from the floor. Concerns were expressed about the Club's capability to finance such a project and the priorities of this project over other needs, such as an area for providing easy in and out for trailorable small sail boats. Following this duscussion a motion to give the Board a vote of confidence was passed by a substantial majority.

#### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS HAVE BEEN AMMENDED

A new class of membership was created at the 1978 Spring B.L.Y.C. Membership Meeting. Application for membership from prospective members under 35 years of age, may now be received with only \$50 of the Initiation Fee paid at the time of joining. The full fee must be paid in \$50 annual installments and fully paid by the member's 35th birthday. Such Assiciate Members have full Club use but cannot vote until Initiation Fee is fully paid. Talk to your young friencs and give them an opportunity to have fun with us.
