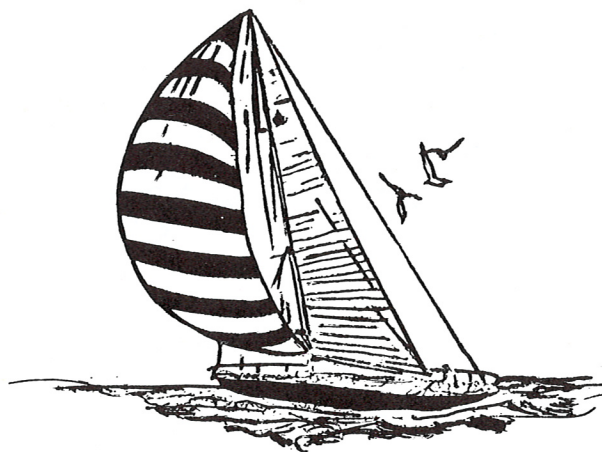
We are sorry to hear of the recent deaths of Ralph Woolby and Mildred Moran. Our condolences to Ella and Governor Louis Cartwright.

AT JUNE MEETING BOARD ADOPTS PLAN TO INCREASE MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION

One benefit of membership in BLVC is having a place to go for fun and fellowship where you know a group of congenial friends will be found.

In order to encourage members to use their club more and thus to get more out of their membership, the Board of Governors adopted a resolution at the June meeting. The resolution will make a requirement that each active member spend \$60 each year for food or refreshments. This requirement will become effective with the onset of the club's fiscal year, September, 1978.

Kitchen and bar checks will be made for each member to be paid before leaving each day. In that manner we will be able to enforce the liquor license requirements that only Club members purchase liquor and the Club will have a record of each member's participation.

Three months before the end of the fiscal year (June 1) members who have not used up their \$60 will be sent a reminder.

If you already spend more than \$60 a year at the Club, this regulation will not effect your pocketbook adversely. It will increase your fun at the Club as there may be more old friends around when you come here. If you don't use the Club that much, don't get upset - come out and "Try it - you'll like it." You are really not getting your memberships worth if you are not using the Club.

NEW SOFT DRINK MACHINE

A coin operated soft drink machine has been installed next to the pay telephone. This will now make it possible for anyone, especially Juniors, to get soft drinks without tying up the bar. Soft drinks will also be available during the day when the front part of the Club is open during the summer, but the bar is closed. It is felt this machine will improve service at the bar. 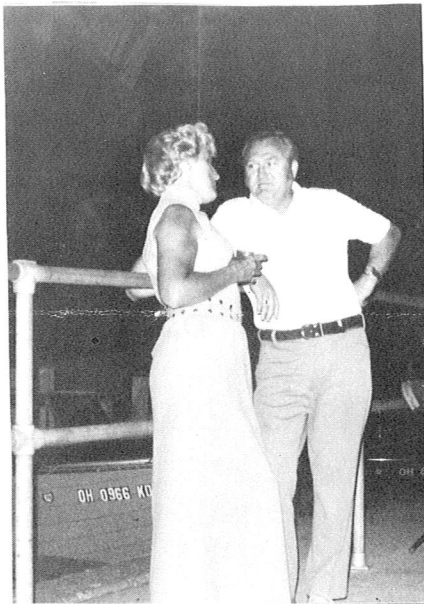
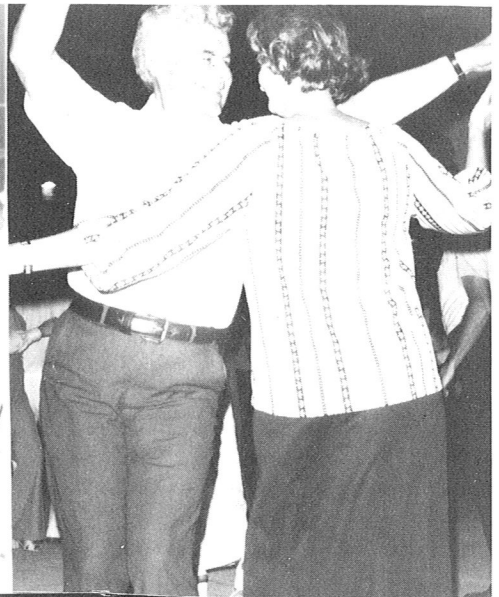
