The 1978-79 BLYC Board of Governors has met and agreed to work toward the completion of the two large club improvements proposed by the 1977-78 Board.

The boathouses will be razed, probably by the end of October under the direction of RC Jim Dressel. This is a mammoth project and I hope many of you will be helping in clearing away the debris and reinforcing the Sea Wall this fall and winter. New slips, with or without roofing, will be built next spring.

The addition to the Kitchen and Dining room, will start under the direction of Virgil Bateman and VC Gale Roshon. Detailed architects plans were drawn by member Ray Sherman. State Engineering Dept. approval has been secured. Mack Wood, (our friendly contractor) will start construction of Phase I this month. This will be the exterior only. Interior finishing, insulation, cabinets, plumbing, etc. will progress through the winter largely, with the club members

These two projects will be accomplished with considerable borrowed money and donated time and materials. The Board feels these are things the club members want in order to improve the club facilities. The increased participation in club activities this past year, supports this feeling.






