THE VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE IS BEAUTIFUL!

It doesn't matter whether one is talking about the actual view from the bridge from the toe path to Watkins Island or the "figure of speech" bridge from whence the course of BLYC is directed.

Most everyone who comments on walking over to the club house says that the removal of the boat houses has markedly improved the appearance of the club property. Many members are asking that consideration be given to replacing the boat houses with open slips suitable for larger boats. Gov. Ed Ballanger, Chairman of Facilities, will be exploring dock needs and confering with RC Jim Dressel who is responsible for dock construction. If you have suggestions, confer with them.



From the administrative bridge, the operation of the club is beautiful because of the marvelous manner in which each flag officer and governor and committee chairman is functioning. RC Dressel has accomplished administrative miracles in getting the Buckeye Lake Park employees to tear down the boat houses, and he is now working with the state officers to get a permit to build a new sea wall where both docks were. Governors Bateman and Greiner are finding bargain price steel with which to build the wall. VC Roshon is studying types of windows which he will put into the new addition. Governor Bateman is watching daily construction of the new addition, and making construction modifications as we go along. Comm. Wuellner and Comm. Limes have done heroic work in repairing and installing the "Bubbler system" and in installing plumbing into the new construction as it goes along. Gov. Greiner is organizing great things for the Juniors and Winter Sailing Education Program-see details inside-Gov. Foster has parties that get so much participation that we need more room. Gov. Rogers had to expand the October log to 14 pages and is working on last minute revisions of the club directory. Gov. Ballanger has processed about 6 new members and is working out facility assignments. Gov. Rising is getting the "ice breakers" under way. Comm.-Trustee Dave Cox is soliciting funds for the boat house improvement. Comm. Earl Williams took his cocktail hour to get club officers portraits.

DOCKS - RC Jim Dressel

The old covered boathouses on the East side of our island were torn-down on schedule. The Demolition started October 27th and ended November 2nd at a cost of \$2,083.00. Thanks again to everyone who helped with this project.

Our next step is to replace the old cement wall abutting the former boathouses. Plans are presently being drawn and cost figures estimated. I have asked the Board of Governors and Trustees to allocate \$10,000 for this project which, I feel, should be fairly close to actual costs. Our present thinking is to drive a new steel wall anywhere from 6 to 12 foot in front of the old cement wall using the old boathouse supports and dirt from the club addition project for fill. Additional fill can be dredged from the lake bottom.

The members on the dock project committee are working on new boat slip drawings for this area which will be posted when completed. Many club members have expressed a desire not to cover the new slips thereby making them available for larger cruisers and even large houseboats. Any comments, please submit to me in writing. 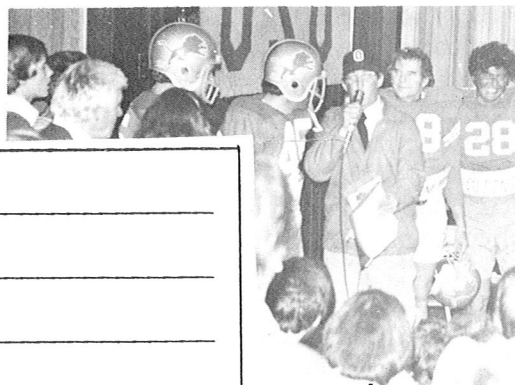

Race Committee

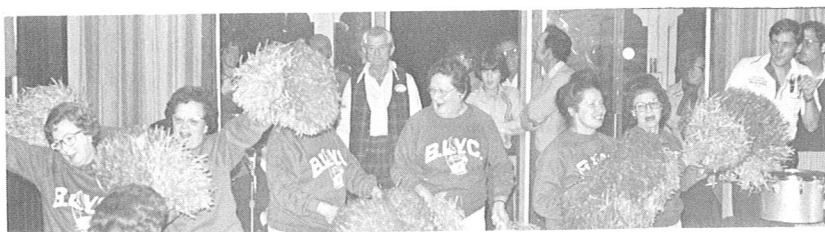
Gov. George Rising
