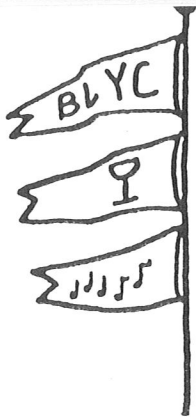

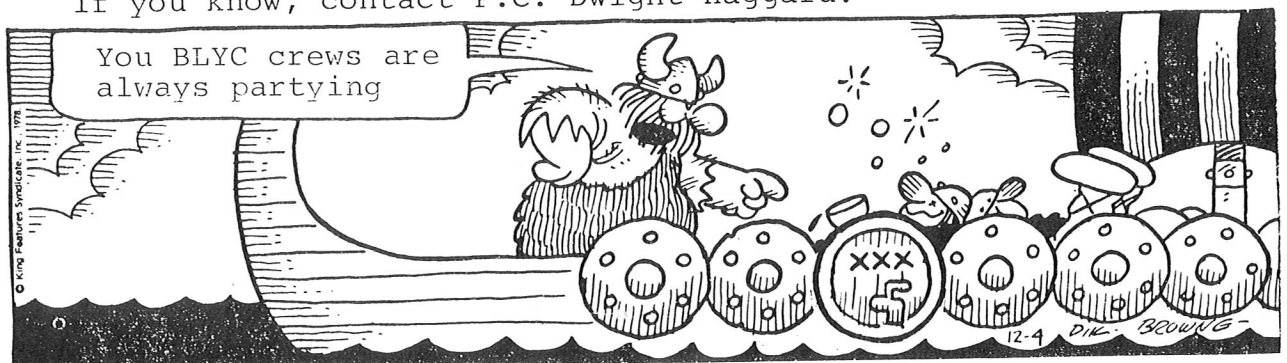

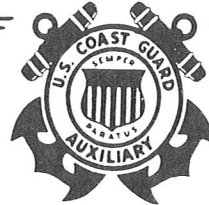

If there are requests I do not know about or if any member has a new request, please inform me in writing.

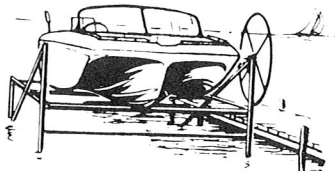
 The old boat house area will not be assigned until a later date. However, requests will still be accepted for them, and assignment will be made based upon the dock size and the best usage.

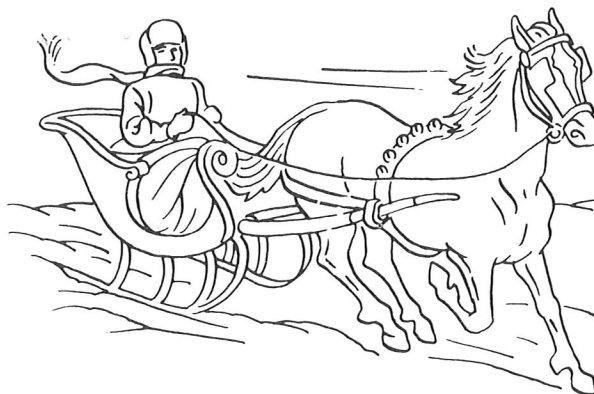
