Utilization of the Bar & Kitchen for September-January (as measured by gross receipts) is 34% above the same period of the previous year.

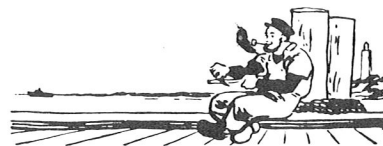

## GOV. RISING

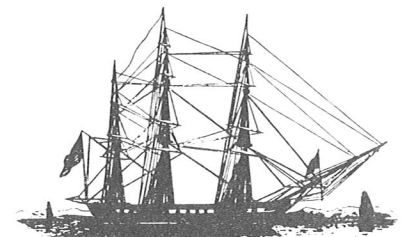

Bob Palmer, N , of the Columbus Power Squadron will again conduct Continuing Education courses for the Ohio State University in Coastal Navigation and Celestial Navigation this spring and summer.

Coastal Navigation is 9 sessions starting March 27, at 7:00P.M. - 9:30 and every Tuesday thru May 22. The fee is \$72. No prerequisite is required.

Celestial Navigation is 13 sessions, also on Tuesdays 7:00P.M.-9:00P.M. June 5, thru August 28. The fee is \$95. A prerequisite course of either Coastal Navigation or U.S.Power Squadron's Advance Piloting or it's equivalent is necessary.
