#### GOV. GEORGE RISING

The racing season started at BLYC on May 13th when the Venture Fleet sailed their first race of Sunday series #1. The wind died after the start and it was necessary to shorten the course. Phil Ragno got off to a good season start by taking first place followed by Dave Miller, Jeff Wagner, Tom Erickson, Gordon Forster, Leigh Rising, Frank Foster and Bob Zeiher. Unfortunately, the wind (lack thereof) caused cancellation of the race on the 20th before it ever got started.

The Highlanders have not started their series yet but intend to do so in the near future.

The Laser Fleet likewise has not started their series yet mainly because the fleet has been sailing elsewhere. However, they too intend to start soon.

The Sears team had a practice session of working together in the Club's new Thistle when they sailed in a Junior Regatta at Leatherlips on May 13th. The team consisting of Dan Dressel, Mike Hein and Philip Schell placed 14th among the 47 boats taking part.

The Lightning Fleet has advised the Race Committee that they will have no formal series at BLYC but will have races from time to time when their busy off-lake schedule will permit. To say the least they have been active off-lake as have some of our other sailors.

In March Greg Fisher sailed in the Thistle Mid-Winter at St. Petersburg and also in two Snipe Mid-Winters at Miami and Clearwater, Florida. A week later the Lightning sailors were represented on the Lightning Southern Circuit which included regattas at Savannah, St. Petersburg and Miami. Participating in these races were George Fisher, Matt Fisher, Willie Petersilge with Steve Beeson crewing, Jim Dressel with wife Nancy and son Dan crewing, Terry Ottenweller with wife Pat and Randy Knilans crewing and Dan Roshon. Willie and Terry also participated in races at Sanford, Florida. With all the races involved it is impossible to list all the placements but as usual the BLYC representatives did well.

In April, Matt Fisher took second place in a 52 boat Lightning regatta at Red Bank, New Jersey. Greg Fisher took first place sailing a Thistle at Indianapolis. There were 48 boats involved in this. Then Dan Dressel took sixth out of a 72 boat fleet at Indianapolis. Dan was sailing a Laser.

Early in May George Fisher won a regatta at Leatherlips in which 48 Interlakes participated. In the same regatta Greg Fisher took second. You just can't do much better than that. This past week found our BLYC sailors at North Cape, Toledo for a four race series. Jim Dressel with his crew of wife Nancy and Greg Fisher took first place while George Fisher with his crew of Patti Fisher and Dan Dressel took second place. Terry Ottenweller with his wife Pat and Randy Knilans also participated.







What else could possibly be happening!! Well, for one thing Matt Fisher is sailing a Star in preparation for the 1980 Olympic Trials. The pre-trials are in May of this year while the actual trials are in May of 1980. We also have two BLYC crews sailing in the Lightning World Championships in Dallas, June 15-22. There are 45 or more boats that will be sailing but only 17 from the United States qualified and 2 are from BLYC. Nancy Dressel and Greg Fisher will be crewing for Jim Dressel while Matt Fisher will be crewing for George Fisher. We wish you lots of luck. We might even be satisfied with a one-two finish.

That's all the news the Race Committee has to date but there is a lot more coming up this summer. After all, these results are just through May 20, 1979!!






