
Also coming up in November is Trophy Day(Nov. 18) and our first Icebreaker. Check for details in this Log, and mark your calendar accordingly.





SNOWBALL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT


As the now past Snowball Chairman, I would like to report that the Snowball weekends were a success. The gods of wind blessed us and blessed us and blessed us both weekends.

RACING RULES AND TACTICS CLASSES will be offered again this Winter with Dave Miller as Chairman. The classes will include the basic rules and may start with more of a beginners approach. George Fisher has indicated a willingness to do some of the lecturing. The content of the course will have some subject matter in common with the course of last year, but will also have some different topics. We will report later on the details.


NEXT SUMMER is not far off. I am beginning to plan for next year's racing. Please give me your suggestions. I shall see to it that each fleet has a meeting and is scheduled to race at least on Sunday afternoons next Summer. If the fleets don't arrange a schedule, I will. Each member of each fleet needs to get better acquainted with the others and to know that whenever he or she comes to race, other will be there too.

THE 1980 SNOWBALL REGATTA will be chaired by Greg Alspach. Give him your suggestions now as well as your offer to help. This last Snowball was a delight to all who attended. Our Annual Regatta should be the crown jewel for all BLYC sailors.

JACK BEESON has agreed to be the race committee chairman for next year. Every note about racing at BLYC should thank Jack for his good work in the shack and this is no exception. Thanks for this last summer's efforts.

A BLYC PROTEST/APPEAL COMMITTEE for next year has been appointed consisting of two blue ribbon members, George Fisher and Jim Dressel who are recognized not only at BLYC but also nationally as being highly competent racing sailors and very knowledgeable in the rules. I will be the third member of that committee. All protests may be appealed to that Protest/Appeal Committee. Furthermore, in the absence of a Protest Committee after the race, that committee will hear protests at a later time.

A WORD ABOUT PROTESTS. Many sailors enjoy testing their skills against the skills of the other sailors who they admire and

enjoy sailing with. The obvious way to test skills is racing. Competition is only fun, however, when everyone plays in accordance with the same set of rules. We all intend that but we all make an occasional mistake.

This is where protests enter the picture. There are those who want the rules strictly and accurately enforced. Others say they want to race "Just for fun" and not have racing be so "serious". However, when I hear these latter remarks I ask myself what they mean. Either we try to enforce the rules or we don't. The worst situation would be to enforce only some of the rules and only occasionally. If we don't enforce the racing rules, people have no reason to learn the rules and won't observe them. Then we get complaints.

It will be my policy, therefore, to enforce the rules as strictly and accurately as I am able. For that reason I am going to try to appoint a Protest Committee prior to each regular day of club racing as well as for all special races. Protests will be heard immediately after the races unless special circumstances dictate otherwise.

Occasionally a member becomes angry as the result of protests, sometimes with great emotion. While this is understandable after the emotion and strain of the race, it is hoped that the emotional aspect would be gone when the day of racing is gone.

I see two efforts which are required to prevent protests from becoming hostile. First is the maintenance of an orderly, fair and timely protest hearing free from outside influence.

The second effort is a modification of the attitude on the part of some. Referees or umpires are part of all sports competition. Unfortunately, with sailboat racing a referee cannot be out in a boat running up and down the course blowing whistles, stopping the action and passing out penalties. As a result we are stuck with protest committees. A protest should be viewed as a human effort to maintain fairness and equality in the game and to settle differences of opinion in a way which, although imperfect, is our best effort. Additionally, protests are an educational tool. Involvement in a protest proceeding does not make a skipper an evil person nor is it a test of whether that individual is honest or strong.

Hopefully in the coming year there will be no protests because everyone will be so knowledgeable that he or she will not make mistakes and if mistakes are made they will readily be acknowledged. However, if there are protests, I hope they are always viewed as an honest difference of opinion between friends to be resolved by an orderly and fair human effort. Obviously in most instances one skipper must lose the protest. I hope that he or she will always lose with the same sportsmanship, dignity and friendliness as he or she exhibits during the race.


