



It is truly a fine gesture for Gus to set up these awards for these previously "forgotten" Junior sailors.

Dick Loesch who was awarded the Tartan award as Highlander Fleet Champion presented awards to the Highlander Fleet. Jack Beeson on behalf of Lowell Christman presented the Cartwright award to the crew of the Wednesday Highlander Series Champion. This award was presented to Phyllis Rogers and "Mac" Rising. Dan Dressel handed out the Laser trophies. Tom Erickson, the Venture Fleet Captain, presented the Venture awards and also presented a special award to Jack Beeson for his work at the race shack. 



The drawing on the left above is a drawing of the original Club flag of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

It was approved along with the original Constitution (which has been amended several times) at the organizational meeting of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The meeting was held on Sunday, May 6, 1906, at the cottage of Mr. Charles W. Miller on Orchard Island.

The specifications were as follows: A triangular pennant, the hoist of which was to be 2/3s of the length. A blue field extended to a line parallel to the hoist 5/12s of the overall length. A field of red extended from this line to the tip of the pennant.

The Club emblem, consisting of an eight spoke ship's wheel with B on the upper vertical spoke, L on the left horizontal spoke, Y on the right horizontal spoke and C on the lower vertical spoke on a field of white was centrally located on the blue field.

This burgee was the official flag of the Club until the fifth annual meeting of the Club, held on 18 September 1910. During this meeting, under "New Business". Article III of the Constitution was amended changing the Club's emblem and flag to those still in use today.

My interpretation of the above specifications appear in a poster paint drawing in the Commodore's Lounge.


