A Short History of The First Community Church of Buckeye Lake.

I was glad when they said unto me, "Let us go into the house of the Lord"
Psalms 122, v. 1

Early in the summer of 1921, Charles F. Miller, of Basil, Ohio, interested a group of people of the Buckeye Lake area to meet with him for Sunday School around picnic benches behind the Lake Breeze Hotel. The group met in various homes during the winter. A church was organized and erected a building on Picnic Point, which was dedicated in June 1923.

The Rev. Charles Miller served the church until his death in 1947 at which time the church closed its doors for a short time. A group met and organized as Miller Memorial Community Church and engaged Rev. Chester Alspach of Canal Winchester, O. as their pastor. Under his leadership, a new organ was purchased and new pews installed. After his resignation, April 19, 1953, Rev. Howard Meacham accepted a call as minister.

It soon became evident that a larger church was needed and in 1955 two acres of land was purchased on Route 79. Ground was broken on 27 July 1958. The first service was held in the new church on Good Friday, March 27, 1959. The church was dedicated on August 2, 1959.

Since that time a parsonage has been built and dedicated, a Fellowship Center has been completed and dedicated in the name of Mrs. Mamie Reed. The Bell Tower, holding the original bell from the Picnic Point Church was erected in the memory of Beth Braig in 1969.

The first Vacation Bible School was held in 1955 and has been continuing every year since. There are many dedicated teachers, musicians and bus drivers and other helpers who give their time and effort for the Sunday School and Vacation Bible School.

Rev. Meacham resigned in 1969 and was followed by Rev. Jack Swick who resigned in 1974. The Rev. Edward Baldwin came to First Community in December of 1974 and, continuing projects initiated by Rev. Swick, promoted the thirteen stained glass Memorial windows around the chancel, which tell the story of the life of Christ, starting in the northeast corner of the chancel. These windows are a beautiful addition to the large stained glass window which surmounts the chancel.

This window, created in Munich Germany, by Ludwig Von Gerichten, was donated to First Community by him thru his daughter when the present church was built.

The story of the window tells of the descent of the Holy Spirit in the Upper Room, as described in the first two chapters of the Book of Acts. Surrounding Mary, the Mother of Jesus, are the eleven Apostles, and above them the dove, representing the Holy Spirit. To say the least it is awe inspiring.

It is the hope of First Community Church to continue to grow and be of service to God and mankind.



I am trying my best to get "back in the saddle" as soon as possible. Thanks again for all of your wonderful support!!




