# DOCKS & FACILITIES

R.C. FRANK FOSTER

DO YOU WANT YOUR DOCK FOR 1981? Please come to the club and indicate on a chart whether or not you will want to rent your dock next year. If you prefer, you may write or call me at my office and indicate your desire to have the same dock next year. If you would like a change in your dock you must make such a request in writing to me. If you do so, please also indicate whether you will want your same dock so that if a new dock cannot be provided you will still have a slip in which to keep your boat.

The slip request priority list will be published this winter. The by-laws require payment of dock rental fees by May 15th. There is a long list of people who want your dock and will be standing there with check in hand. Please pay before May 1 in order to make my job simple, comfortable and a lot easier.

ALL LOCKS SAWN FROM LOCKERS - REAR COMMODORE GOES BERSERK. Not yet, but if you have a locker I wanted to get your attention. If you have a locker upstairs or underneath the club, please write your name on it, call me, write me or somehow communicate to me that you have that locker. This spring I intend to determine who has what lockers and bill accordingly. In the spring I can saw the locks off the other lockers to open them for use by other members.

Mood replacement. I plan to wait until next spring to survey the total repair needs including any damage caused by ice. Dry sails are owned by the slip renter because they were originally built by members and the by-laws provide that they, not the club, are responsible for maintenance. The club is responsible only for a walkway sufficient to enable you to step onto your boat. The 24ft. 2X10's between dry sails were placed there to support the dry sails and therefore are the maintenance responsibility of the slip owners. The club, however, will provide the top decking for those slips with dry sails.

DOCK PLANNING COMMITTEE. I plan to appoint a Dock Planning Committee late this fall or winter. They will be requested to investigate and evaluate the coming needs of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club with respect to Docks and to make recommendations as to how those needs might be best met. It is my expectation that this committee will need more than one year to complete its work, although some interim recommendations may be generated. Please let me know if you would like to serve on this committee.
