Did You Know That ? ? ?

A Short History of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic Church.

For many years the people coming from Columbus to spend a weekend at Buckeye Lake, had to travel to Newark or Lancaster Ohio to fulfill their Sunday obligation. During these years many people had asked the Bishop for a chapel at Buckeye Lake.

In the late 1920's Bishop James J. Hartley of Columbus, asked Messers. William and August Wehrle to find a suitable location for a chapel.

On 12 July 1927 the brothers Wehrle donated \$5,000 to purchase the property located on Lancaster Road just a short distance from the entrance to the then existing Park. The property was purchased from Mr. & Mrs. Reinhard Wilke.

With funds and pledges solicited by Mr. J.W.Wuellner, father of Past Comm. Wilbur Wuellner, and Mr. Henry Gantner, and monies from Card Parties given by such ladies as Mrs. J.Wuellner, Comm. Wuellner's mother, Mrs. F. Obert, Mrs. Schadt, Mrs. Sears, Mrs. G. Rinehard and Mrs. Borchert, building was started early in 1928. The new English Gothic style church was dedicated in early December 1928. It was dedicated to our Blessed Mother under the Name of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, because the title of the property was given to the Bishop on that Feast Day.

Monsignor Joseph A. Weigand, Rector of St. Charles Seminary, Columbus, was placed in charge of the new Parish. For the next 12 years he provided Priests each Sunday. These Priests were professors at the Seminary. They were Msgr. J.A.Weigand, Msgr. H.Mattingly, Msgr. Matthew A. Howard and Father Martin J. Lacey, S.S.C.C..

The Dominican Sisters from Newark taught Sunday School and prepared the children for Holy Communion. In 1943 there were 38 children attending these classes.

By 1945 the Parish had grown in membership to the extent that Bishop Ready appointed a regular pastor to residence. In 1948 during the pastorate of Father J.J.Sughrue the present rectory was built.

In 1950, the sons of Mr. & Mrs. J.W.Wuellner donated the Angelus Chimes and Bells that ring daily at 7:00 A.M.; 12:00 Noon and 6:00 P.M.. The Angelus consists of 3 sets of 3 chimes followed by the bell ringing 30 times.

The continued growth of the Parish has caused some changes. In 1960, under the pastorate of Father McEwan, the present Parish Hall was built. During Msgr. Mattingly's pastorate (1969-1974) the church was renovated to conform with the new liturgy as dictated by Vatican Council II.

The pastors in residence are as follows, Father Sughrue, 1948-1951; Father Curran, 1951-1954; Father Eyerman, 1954-1956; Father McEwan, 1956-1964; Father McCormick, 1964-1969; Msgr. Mattingly, 1969-1974; Father Lawler, 1974 to the present time.

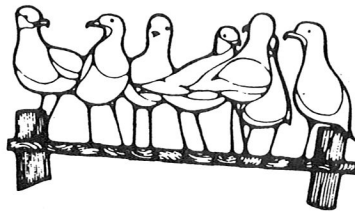
When Father Lawler became Pastor of the Parish, the membership stood at 350 members. The present membership is 700 members.

The boundaries of the Parish are, Highway #310 on the West, Highpoint Road on the South, Brownsville Road on the East and on the North, the Southern boundary of Heath. This area is like a circle with a radius of 15 miles with the church in the center.

The Grotto to the east of the church, which is similar to the entrance of the church was dedicated in 1978.

Father Lawler, the present Pastor is a "C.B." enthusiast. His "C.B." "Handle" or name is "Bullhorn". You may have heard him on the air.

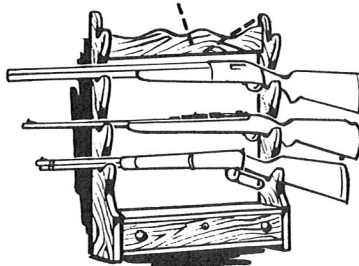
Historically, the First Baptism was Esther Amsbaugh on 14 August, 1929; First Communion, a class of 6 was in 1933; the First Confirmation, with 22 members was 4 May, 1948; the First Funeral was Margaret Braig on 23 August, 1930

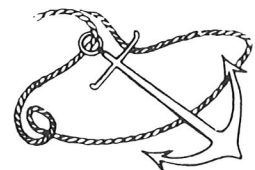
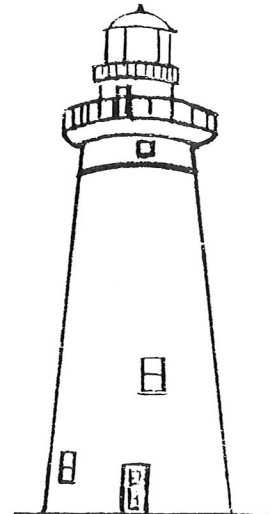

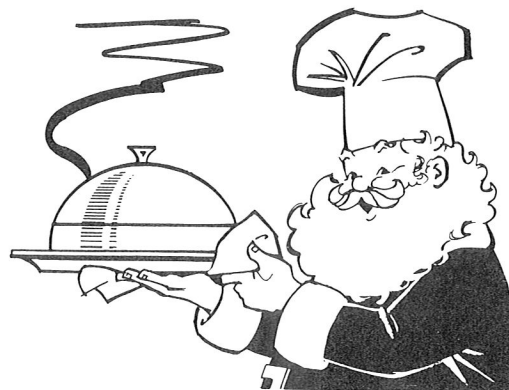
Parties (luncheon or dinner) are encouraged. We can accomodate 5 to 200 people (with notice, of course) So keep us in mind.

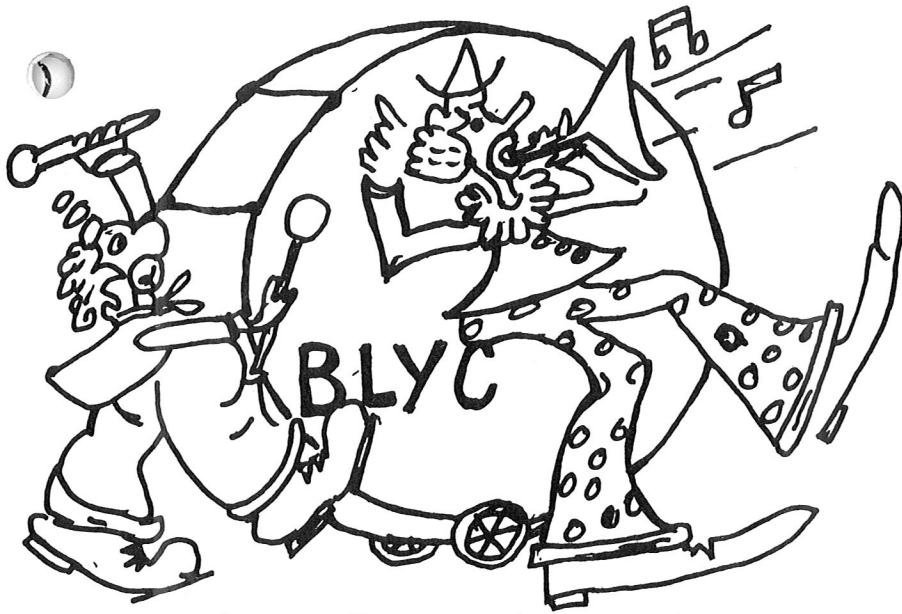

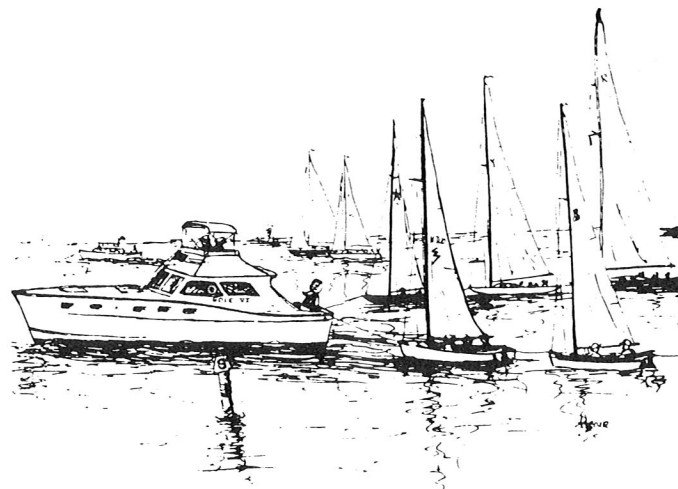

The Halloween party was well attended, with about 67 members and guests. There were lots of great costumes,

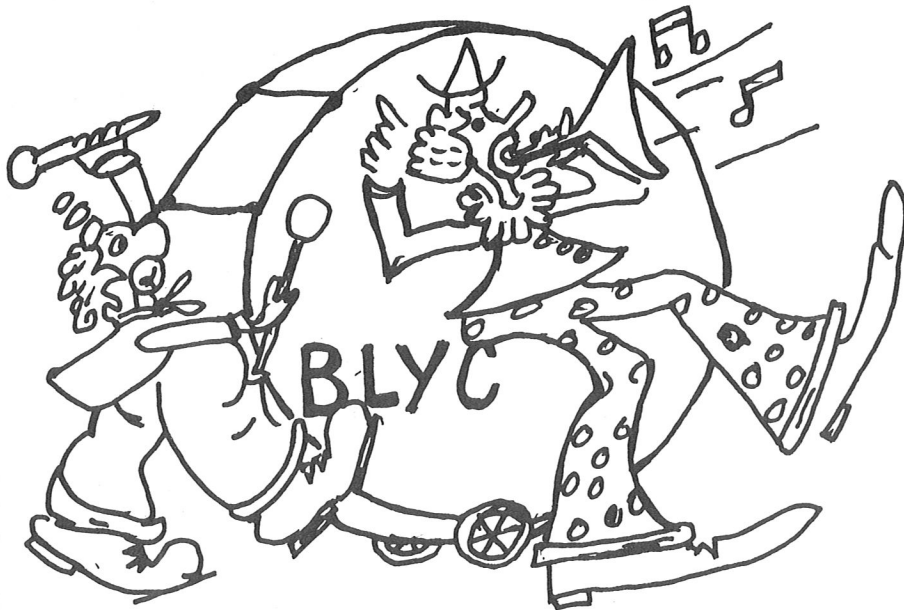

THANK YOU to Whitey Limes and Wilbur Wuellner for reinstalling, repairing, maintaining and preparing for Winter the bubbler system in Areas 1 through 7 and for making needed repairs in Area 8. Without Whitey and Wilbur our docks would probably end up on Cranberry Island next Spring.

A thank you is also due to Don Hardy, Larry Arnold, Tom Erickson, Carl Erickson and Gov. Gordon Forster for assembling the bubbler system parts in Area 8 and making some needed, temporary repairs to the other docks for the Winter on the Fall work day.

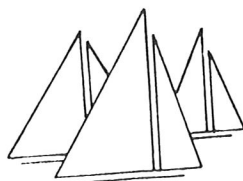
Some of these people don't currently own boats. Additionally, the Governor in Charge of Docks is required to assign boats to appropriate sized slips in order to efficiently use our facilities.

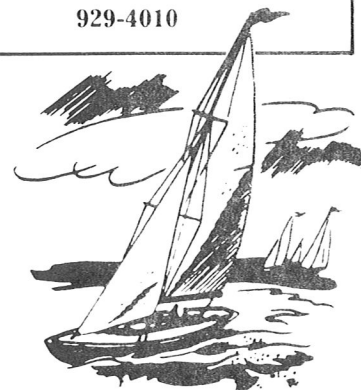
